This policy is not intended to deprive any person of his/her right to freedom of expression, but only to maintain, to the extent possible and reasonable, a safe, harassment-free environment. Any individual who disrupts or threatens to disrupt school/office operations; threatens the health and safety of students or staff; willfully causes property damage; uses loud and/or offensive language which could provoke a

violent reaction; or who has otherwise established a continued pattern of unauthorized entry on school district property, will be directed to leave school or school district property promptly.

Education Code 220 prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability, gender, gender identity, gender expression, nationality, race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, or any other characteristic that is contained in the definition of hate crimes set forth in Section 422.55 of the Penal Code, including immigration status.

Public speakers shall be allocated a maximum of three (3) minutes to address the board regarding any item or items. The number of minutes allowed for each speaker shall be determined by the number of speakers who submit their names prior to the beginning of public comment. When translation is requested, up to three additional minutes will be provided for English translation.

- 16-30 speakers: 1.5 minutes each
- 31+ speakers: 1 minute each

### PEACHJAR DIGITAL FLYER DISTRIBUTION PLATFORM

### **Background**

The Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District establishes a culture that encourages positive relationships among students, staff, and families as well as educational, business, and community partners. One of the many ways staff works to accomplish this is by utilizing all available resources to communicate with district stakeholders and the community at large. This includes print and digital flyer distribution as set forth by Board Policy 1315, *Distribution of Materials in Schools*, which states: "The Board of Education recognizes that there may be legitimate needs for the use of the district's distribution capabilities by community groups in order to distribute information flyers to students for purposes other than the conduct of the educational program." At this time, the district hopes to improve upon the existing process for collecting and distributing such materials. As such, the Superintendent's Office is asking the Board to consider approving an agreement with Peachjar, a leading cloud-based communication platform that streamlines the process of distributing school and district updates and community resources directly to families as digital flyers. Over 1,000 school districts nationwide use Peachjar including surrounding districts such as Fullerton, Garden Grove, Newport-Mesa, and Santa Ana. The agreement outlines a one-time fee and there are no annual or recurring fees for the service. The agreement includes all training for district and school personnel and customer support in perpetuity.

### Acknowledgments

Peachjar, Inc. ("Peachjar") will provide District with access and use of Peachjar's digital flyer management system (the "Service") as further described in the attached Quote, subject to the below terms and conditions. This License Agreement, together with the attached Quote, shall constitute the entire "Agreement."

- 1. License Grants. Subject to the terms of this Agreement, (1) Peachjar grants District a non-exclusive, non-transferable limited license to use the Service for the approval and distribution of informational digital flyers, and (2), District grants Peachjar a non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use District data only to the extent necessary to provide the Service as described under Section 3 (Authorized Use & Purpose) below. Such license shall survive the termination of this Agreement for a period of up to 12 months, solely for storing backup District data.
- 2. Fees. District shall pay the Total fee of \$11,438.50 listed at the bottom of the Quote which shall be due thirty (30) days after District executes this Agreement. There shall be no fee for future renewals in subsequent renewal terms/years. District agrees that the Startup Fee shall not be reduced if District chooses to implement the Service for a number of students that is less than the number shown in the "# of Students" column in the attached Quote. There shall be no additional fee for District to add students in the future. Startup Fee is non-refundable.
- 3. Authorized Use & Purpose. In conjunction with Section 1 (License Grant) above, unlimited use of the Service shall be provided to District staff, school staff, and the authorized parent group(s) at each school subject to Peachjar's Terms of Use Policy as set forth on its website. Peachjar will be compensated from external organizations that choose to contract directly with Peachjar for posting and email distribution of their digital flyers through the Service subject to District flyer approval (for which Peachjar has no authority or responsibility over). Peachjar will be solely responsible for billing and collection from such external organizations. District agrees, to its best efforts, that all participating schools will not distribute paper flyers from external organizations or post/distribute digital flyers from external organizations in a manner that would circumvent Peachjar's compensation. However, schools may place paper copies of flyers in the school office area. Additionally, schools may distribute paper flyers from any source provided that such paper flyer distribution is done in conjunction with digital flyer distribution through the Service. Peachjar will ensure

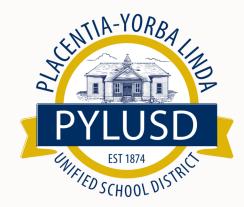

that no digital flyers from external organizations shall be emailed to parents/legal guardians or posted to school webpages through the Service without District approval. District understands and agrees that in conjunction with posting and distributing digital flyers, Peachjar enables communications between approved organizations and parents/legal guardians for the purposes of facilitating sign-ups, providing supplies that may be necessary for participation in activities, and enabling parents/legal guardians to access additional information. Under no circumstances will Peachjar sell, license or otherwise redistribute any personally identifiable information from student records or contained within District data.

- 4. Obligations & Actions to be Conducted by District. Prior to the Service Start By Date, District agrees to: (i) place an approved Peachjar button (logo with link) on the home page of each school's website; (ii) implement processes to ensure District's Student Information System (SIS) contains a comprehensive list of parent/legal guardian email addresses; (iii) use Peachjar's secure file transfer process to load into the system a full list of all parent/guardian email addresses and update this list to Peachjar through SFTP at least once every 90 days; (iv) place information on the District website to inform external organizations of the Peachjar Service; (v) provide Peachjar with a current contact list of external organizations who have previously distributed flyers; and (vi) approve flyers from external organizations that meet district guidelines.
- 5. Term and Termination. This Agreement shall commence immediately upon execution of this Order Authorization by District, and continue for one year after the Service Start Date. This Agreement shall automatically renew on the anniversary of the Service Start Date for successive one (1) year periods unless either party provides written notice to the other of its desire not to renew at least 30 days prior to the end the then-current term.
- 6. Confidentiality and Protection of Information. Peachjar shall use commercially reasonable efforts to ensure that District data will be safeguarded against loss or theft, as well as unauthorized access, disclosure, copying, or use. Peachjar warrants that it complies with FERPA regulations and will not sell, license or otherwise redistribute any personally identifiable information from student records or contained within District data unless required by law, regulation or court order. District represents and warrants that District shall not deliver student email addresses to Peachjar to ensure COPPA compliance and shall maintain confidentiality regarding all pricing terms of this Agreement.
- 7. Indemnity & Limitations of Liability. District recognizes that Peachjar does not verify the accuracy of information nor filter/review/approve the content that is contained in the digital flyers or provided to District by third-party organizations as part of the digital flyer approval process. The parties shall defend, indemnify, and hold each other harmless from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, lawsuits, liabilities, damages and expenses (including reasonable attorneys fees) arising from the acts or omissions of the other party, its officers, directors, shareholders, employees and agents and sub-agents, and of any other person or persons acting under its or their direction and control, or of any of them. Neither party shall be liable for any indirect, incidental, special or consequential damages arising out of or in connection with this Agreement, and each party's aggregate liability hereunder shall not exceed the amount of the fees paid or payable by District to Peachjar within the prior 12 months preceding the claim.

In order to comply with AB 1200/2756, the District must disclose the major provisions of collective bargaining agreement, including costs for current and future years, at a public meeting before entering into the agreement.

Additionally, class size maximums were revised to reflect all current teaching assignments and language was agreed to in order to clarify duty-free uninterrupted lunch and relief periods. Clarity was provided in relation to the Teacher Induction Program and Peer Assistance Review Program in order to provide better support to our new and veteran teachers. Language was also agreed to in order to provide more leadership influence in regards to the Professional Learning Community process, which fosters collaboration to support student achievement. Lastly, an increase in the salary for teachers was agreed to.

The agenda item presents for Board consideration approval of the Tentative Agreement between APLE and the PYLUSD.

December 20, 2023

This Tentative Agreement represents the completion of negotiations for the 2023-2024 school year as reached by both parties on December 20, 2023. This agreement is subject to any and all ratifications and approval processes required by both parties. All changes in this Agreement will be effective at the start of the 2024-2025 school year unless otherwise indicated.

### **Article I: Agreement**

1. Modify the article to read as follows:

This agreement is entered into this 16th 1st day of January April, 20242 by and between the Board of Education of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District, hereinafter referred to as "District" and the Association of Placentia-Linda Educators/CTACalifornia Teachers Association/NEA National Education "Association", hereinafter referred to as "Association". This agreement shall supersede any rules, regulations or practices of the District which are contrary to or inconsistent with its terms. This Agreement shall remain in effect until June 30, 20254.

For the years 2021-2022 and 2023-2024 2025-2026 school years, the Association and/or District may each reopen the article on wages and benefits and two other articles at the choice of the Association and two other articles at the choice of the District. The parties agree to an automatic reopener on the following topics:

- a. <u>Association request for adequate music, PE, adaptive PE office/work space</u>
- b. <u>District request to define responsibilities of high school department chairpersons and middle school/elementary lead teachers</u>

For the 202<u>6</u>2-202<u>7</u>3 school year, either party may open any article. All temporary agreements attached to the contract shall be extended for one additional year.

### **Article XIII: Evaluation Procedures**

1. Modify Section E(3) to read as follows:

"Unit members with permanent status, who have been employed for at least ten (10) years with the school district as a certificated bargaining unit member, are highly qualified, and whose previous evaluation rated the employee as meeting or exceeding standards are to be evaluated at least every five (5) years.

- a. The unit member or the evaluator may rescind this agreement at any time <u>during the teacher work year</u>, in <u>writing</u>, for the following school year, but not in the current school year.
  - b. The evaluation rating of meeting or exceeding standards refers to an overall standard rating in one of the six standards.

c. Except as provided in section E(3), for purpose of initial placements on the five (5) year cycle for the 2017-2018 school year, all unit members shall be considered to have met the criteria of exceeding or meeting standards in their previous evaluation unless they received an unsatisfactory in one of the overall standards ratings.

d. Except as provided in section E(3), beginning in the 2017-2018 school year, unit members next evaluation eyele shall be five (5) years minus the year of their last evaluation (for example a unit member evaluated in the 2016-17 school year next evaluation will be the 2021-22 school year and a member evaluated in the 2015-16 school year next evaluation will be 2020-21 school year).

e. Except as provided in section E(3), changes in site, job description, or evaluator due to transfer or reassignment shall not affect the established evaluation cycle of the permanent unit member."

2. Modify Section F(4)(a) to read as follows:

"When a "needs to improve" or "unsatisfactory" is included on <u>form F of</u> the <u>annual on-cycle</u>, <u>formal</u> evaluation, a conference between the unit member and the evaluator shall be held prior to June 1 in order to review the contents of the scheduled written evaluation."

# **Article XIV: Wages**

1. Modify Section A (1) to read as follows:

"Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, the newly hired unit members with a California teaching credential shall be credited for any TK-12 teaching experience in the United States with experience outside the district may not start above Step 6 in any column. In accordance with California law, a year of teaching experience constitutes having served for at least 75 percent of the number of days in the school year. Initial salary placement credit for any related higher education or clinical experience shall be given as approved by the Professional Growth Committee."

2. Reorganize Section D (1) (b) to read as follows:

"Number of stipends assigned for chairpersons per high school

- (1) Each high school shall receive Seven (7) stipends for an enrollment of 1800 or less
- (2) and Eight (8) stipends for an enrollment above 1800
- (3) Nine (9) stipends for an enrollment between 2000 and 2250
- (4) Ten (10) stipends for an enrollment between 2250 and 2800
- (5) Eleven (11) stipends for an enrollment between 2800 and 3000 and
- (6) Twelve (12) stipends above 3000
- (72) The continuation high school shall receive two (2) stipends.
- (<u>8</u> <del>3</del>) Each school shall receive up to three (3) days of substitute time for each stipend."

- 3. Modify Section D (2) (a) to read as follows:
  - "<u>Definition of a stipend for middle school lead teachers is determined by the number of</u> periods supervised by lead persons
    - (1) 6-12 periods 0.0125 of Step 1 of Column IV
    - (2) 13 or more periods 0.001 of Step 1 of Column IV for each period in excess of 12"
- 4. Modify Section D (3) (a) to read as follows:
  - "Definition of a stipend for elementary school lead teachers is determined by 0.0125 of Step 1 of Column IV."
- 5. Modify Section D (3) (b) to read as follows:
  - "Number of stipends assigned for elementary school lead teachers
    - (1) 300 student population or fraction thereof Three (3) Two (2) positions
    - (2) 450 student population or fraction thereof Four (4) Three (3) positions
    - (3) 600 student population or fraction thereof Five (5) Four (4) positions
    - (4) 750 student population or fraction thereof  $\underline{Six}$  (6) Five (5) positions
    - (5) 900 student population or fraction thereof Seven (7) Six (6) positions
    - (6) 1050 student population or fraction thereof <u>Eight (8)</u> Seven (7) positions

9. Modify Section F to read as follows:

"Peer Assistance and Review (P.A.R.) and Teacher Induction Program

The District and the Association agree to establish a program of peer assistance and review pursuant to Education Code 44500 and a Teacher Induction Program to support teachers in clearing their preliminary teaching credentials. These programs allow This program allows exemplary teachers to assist veteran teachers in need of development in subject matter knowledge or teaching strategies, or both. As locally determined, these programs will also provide support to new teachers and teachers volunteering for the program. This program is expressly contingent on receipt by the District of all sums to which it is entitled under the Education Code Section 44500 and on the sufficiency of said funds to pay the cost of these provisions.

(1) The Peer Assistance and Review Program will be coordinated by a <u>panel</u> "Joint Panel" (JP) consisting of three (3) classroom teachers chosen by the association and two (2) administrators selected by the District.

- (2) The Consulting Teacher (CT) is a teacher who provides assistance and support to new and veteran teachers. Consulting teachers are interviewed and selected by the Induction Coordinator, a Human Resources Administrator, and an Educational Services Administrator. The qualifications for consideration to become a consulting teacher are as follows:
  - (a) A credentialed classroom teacher with permanent status for the PAR Program.
  - (b) A credentialed classroom teacher with permanent status or TOSA for the Induction Program.
  - (c) At least five (5) years of recent teaching experience in classroom instruction.
  - (d) Demonstrated exemplary teaching ability, effective communication skills, subject matter knowledge and mastery of a range of teaching strategies necessary to meet the needs of pupils in different contexts.

The unit member selected as Consulting Teacher shall be compensated at the certificated hourly rate for up to 40 hours for one Participating Teacher, up to a total of 60 hours for two Participating Teachers, and up to a total of 80 hours for three Participating Teachers.

The Joint Panel shall meet as necessary to provide direction for the program and may only take action when a quorum is present. A quorum consists of at least two (2) teachers and at least one (1) administrator.

- b. The Joint Panel has the following responsibilities: (1) Selection of a chairperson. This position will alternate each year between an Association and District representative.
  - (1) Selection of a chairperson. This position will alternate each year between an Association and District representative.
  - (2) Selection of the Consulting Teachers (CT)
  - (3) Review peer review reports
  - (4) Recommend program modifications
  - (5) Forward list of review participants to the Board
  - (6) Coordinate P.A.R. staff development training with Educational Services Division and other programs.
- (3) A Participating Teacher (PT) is a first or second-year teacher, a teacher volunteering for the PAR program, or a teacher referred to the PAR program. Teachers participating in the program will have a Consulting Teacher assigned to them by the Induction Coordinator (in the case of the Induction Program participants) or the Human Resources Administrator in collaboration with the principal (in the case of a volunteer or referred teacher to the PAR Program). The Consulting Teacher will provide either support and/or assistance as defined:
  - (a) A Consulting Teacher will serve as a support provider for the following:
    - (i) A first or second year teacher in the Induction program
    - (ii) A teacher in an intern or pre-intern program or serving with an emergency teaching credential.
    - (iii) A permanent teacher who volunteers for support and assistance.
    - (iv) A referred teacher is a permanent teacher who has received an unsatisfactory evaluation in the area of teaching methods or subject matter knowledge, who needs support and assistance as indicated on

the teacher evaluation or at the recommendation of the site level administrator.

- (b) Observations, records, and reports regarding the unit member's participation in the program will be confidential and only shared with the referring parties (Principal, Human Resources Administrator, Induction Coordinator).
- (c) Consulting Teachers will provide support or assistance by demonstrating, observing, coaching, conferencing, referring or by other activities.

The Consulting Teacher (CT) is a teacher who provides assistance and support to new and veteran teachers. The qualifications for consideration to become a consulting teacher are as follows:

- (1) A credentialed classroom teacher with permanent status.
- (2) At least five (5) out of the last seven (7) years of recent teaching experience in classroom instruction.
- (3) Demonstrated exemplary teaching ability, effective communication skills, subject matter knowledge and mastery of a range of teaching strategies necessary to meet the needs of pupils in different contexts.
- d. A Participating Teacher (PT) is a first or second year teacher, a teacher volunteering for the program or a referred teacher. Teachers participating in the program will have a Consulting Teacher assigned to them by the Joint Panel that will provide them either support or assistance as defined:
  - (1) A Consulting Teacher will serve as a support provider for the following:
    - (a) A first or second year teacher in collaboration with the Beginning Teacher Support and Assessment System (BTSA)
    - (b) A teacher in an intern or pre-intern program or serving with an emergency credential.
    - (e) A permanent teacher who volunteers for the program
    - (d) Observations and reports regarding the unit member's participation in the program will be confidential and only shared with the participating teacher's consent to any other party.
  - (2) A Consulting Teacher will provide assistance to a Referred Teacher. A Referred Teacher is a permanent teacher who has received an unsatisfactory evaluation in the area of teaching methods or subject matter knowledge. The Consulting Teacher will report the progress of the unit member's participation in the program to the Joint Panel. Records and reports related to the unit member's participation in the program will be handled in a confidential manner.
  - (3) Consulting Teachers will provide support or assistance by demonstrating, observing, coaching, conferencing, referring or by other activities.

- (d) e. The PAR <u>and Teacher Induction</u> programs shall expect and strongly encourage a cooperative relationship between the Consulting Teacher and the Principal with respect to the process of peer support, assistance and review.
- (e) f. Functions performed pursuant to this article by unit members are not management or supervisory functions.
- (f) g. Teachers who provide assistance and review shall have the same protection from liability and access to appropriate defense as other public school employees.
- 2. The unit member selected to participate on the Joint Panel or as Consulting Teacher shall be compensated at a maximum rate of \$4,000 per academic year. For purposes of this program, the unit member's academic year equates to 150 clock hours of participation.

#### 10. Salary Increase:

For the 2023-24 school year, unit members will receive a 4% on schedule ongoing increase, retroactive to July 1, 2023. Additionally, unit members will receive a one-time off schedule salary payment equal to 2% of an employee's annual salary for the 2023-2024 school year after the 4% increase listed above is applied to the salary schedule, retroactive to July 1, 2023.

For the 2024-2025 school year, unit members will receive a 2% on schedule increase over the last school year.

#### **Article XVI: Professional Day**

1. Modify Section J to read as follows:

"Every unit member shall be entitled to duty-free uninterrupted lunch and relief period(s) each day <u>during</u> which they are not required to perform any work or be responsible for student supervision."

#### **Appendices**

1. Modify Section 1(b) of the PLC MOU to read as follows:

"PLC Agenda Development

PLC agenda development is the determination of what will be discussed at each PLC meeting. All agenda items shall focus on one or more of the five essential questions. Unit members retain sole discretion of setting their agendas and site administrators shall not send out separate agendas or <u>in any other way direct the agenda</u> influence the staff discussions. Site administrators, however, are encouraged to participate as partners in collaboration, whenever possible. At their discretion, site PLC teams may invite other site or district staff counselors and psychologists to participate in discussions at the discretion of the site team."

2. Move the Elementary Release Time section from the PLC MOU to a separate MOU.

#### **PLC Memorandum of Understanding**

The Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District ("District") and the Association of Placentia-Linda Educators ("APLE") agree to the following as clarification of PLC language in the previously agreed MOUs. This MOU replaces all previous PLC MOUs entered between the District and APLE.

Professional Learning Communities (PLC) have been an integral part of the teaching and learning environment in PYLUSD. Teachers work collaboratively during early release/late start days to create common assessments, analyze results, and adjust instructional practices. Professional development will be provided as needed to support PLC teams with a focus on collaboration and the five essential questions.

PLCs focus on one or more of the following questions:

- 1. What is it we want all students to know and be able to do?
- 2. How will we know all students have learned?
- 3. How will we respond when some students do not learn?
- 4. How will we extend the learning for students who have demonstrated proficiency?
- 5. How do we engage in relevant pedagogy and professional development to ensure that we are collectively answering these questions?

The District and APLE believe in the power of teacher collaboration. To that end, time has been established for teachers to work on the five questions. PLC conversations shall include, but not be limited to, designing instruction, developing common formative assessments, analyzing assessment data and adjusting instruction, identifying and sharing existing and researched-based practices, and identifying and developing academic, behavioral, or socio-emotional interventions. The five (5) questions are not meant to be limited to data-only discussions. As a result, we agree with the following beliefs and practices related to teacher collaboration.

#### 1(a) PLC Calendar Development

PLC calendar development shall be collaboratively developed between the staff and the site administration. Unit members will meet by department/grade level to discuss preferences, after which the leadership team in collaboration with site administrators will meet to develop a tentative schedule based on input from all departments/grade levels. (If an APLE representative is not a member of the leadership team, one APLE representative should be invited to participate in the development of the rotation schedule.)

The options for PLC calendar development are Vertical/Department or Horizontal/Grade Level meetings. The calendar development shall not determine the agenda for each PLC meeting. The schedule will be presented to the staff for final review prior to the start of each school year. If consensus between the staff and the site administrator cannot be reached, the process shall begin again until a consensus can be reached.

At the conclusion of the process, the site administrator and APLE site representative shall sign the District's PLC: Annual Calendar Development Form (Appendix) and the site administrator shall submit the form to Human Resources by the end of the 2nd calendar

week of the school year. Human Resources will send a copy of the form to the APLE President by the 3rd Wednesday in September. If the APLE site representative cannot sign the form because he/she believes the process was not followed, the next site PLC day shall be used to reach agreement with a representative from Human Resources and APLE (selected by APLE) to help facilitate an agreement.

# 1(b) PLC Agenda Development

PLC agenda development is the determination of what will be discussed at each PLC meeting. All agenda items shall focus on one or more of the five essential questions. Unit members retain sole discretion of setting their agendas and site administrators shall not send out separate agendas or in any other way direct the agenda. Site administrators, however, are encouraged to participate as partners in collaboration, whenever possible. At their discretion, PLC teams may invite other site or district staff to participate in discussions.

Unit member teams may utilize PLC time for staff development at the discretion of the team. Unit members are not required to take minutes or fill out any paperwork other than providing the site administrator with an agenda at least 48 hours (including weekends) in advance. Sign-in sheets will be submitted, by the end of the week, to the principal or designee after each meeting, however the sign-in sheet shall be for the purpose of attendance not for a date and time stamp to determine when a unit member arrived to the meeting.

- 2. Two early release/late start days will be designated for mandatory trainings and/or District-wide Initiatives as determined by the District. These days will be scheduled at each school site according to this MOU with district-wide initiatives being placed first by the site administrator on the PLC site calendar. These meetings shall not exceed 60 minutes.
- 3. Eight early release/late start days (not including pre-service days) will be designated for the use of staff meetings and/or professional development at the discretion of the site administrator. These eight days will be tentatively placed on the calendar, after consultation with the site leadership team, prior to the PLC calendar development discussion with staff. Agendas for those days will be set by the site administrator and all staff are expected to attend.
- 4. Six early release/late start days will be designated for teacher planning per year (including but not limited to quarterly planning, lesson planning, report card preparation, grading, etc.). These days will be initially designated by the site administrator and leadership team prior to the start of school and brought to the staff for consensus as part of the PLC calendar development process. No agenda will be requested on these days; however, teachers shall remain on campus during the 60-minute planning period.
- 5. All PLC meetings will be 60 minutes in duration. All staff members on contract duty during the PLC will need to be present for the full 60 minutes. As a result, at all early release sites, teachers will be required to report to school 25 minutes prior to the start of the school day instead of 30 minutes.

- 6. Unit members that are part of stand-alone electives/departments, transitional K, music, elementary PE, Speech, SDC, RSP and other specialized student support providers may meet off-site with prior approval from their site administrator(s).
- 7. Additional staff meetings may only be held for extenuating circumstances requiring immediate action (these might include natural disasters, an accident involving student or staff members, site administrator changes, etc.).
- 8. Teachers should not be called away from collaboration time for other purposes (including but not limited to IEPs), except in extenuating circumstances requiring immediate action. Every effort shall be made to preserve teacher collaboration time.
- 9. PLC meeting norms shall be established by each team and reviewed annually.
- 10. The Association faculty representative shall be granted a minimum of five minutes during regular faculty meetings to announce the agenda for the upcoming Association business unless the Association faculty representative has informed the site administrator one week in advance that they do not need this time.

The contract will remain in effect from January 16, 2024 through June 30, 2025.

#### **Financial Impact**

The District shall pay the Assistant Superintendent of Student Support Services an annual salary in accordance with his employment contract payable in twelve (12) equal monthly increments.

# PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT ORANGE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

This EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District (the "District") and Renee Gray ("Gray" or "Assistant Superintendent") and supersedes any existing employment agreement or arrangement between the District and Gray.

#### 1. TERM OF EMPLOYMENT

The District hereby employs Gray in the position of Assistant Superintendent of Student Support Services for the District from January 16, 2024 through June 30, 2025.

#### 2. <u>SALARY</u>

Gray salary shall be Two Hundred Eighteen Thousand Three Hundred Forty and 00/100 Dollars (\$218,340.00) prorated for the first year and then for each complete year during the term of this Agreement, payable in twelve (12) equal monthly payments. Gray shall also receive all incentives available to other members of the District's certificated management staff, including longevity pay. When only a portion of a year is served, compensation shall be prorated. At any time, the Board of Education of the District ("Board") may take action, at its sole discretion, to increase the compensation provided for in this Agreement. All contract extensions and salary increases shall be approved at a regular meeting of the Board and final actions by the Board shall be recorded in the Board meeting minutes.

#### 3. <u>DUTIES</u>

During the term of the Agreement, Gray shall perform the duties of Assistant Superintendent of Student Support Services as set forth in the District's job description (if any), as directed, and/or such other duties as directed by the District's Superintendent ("Superintendent"), and as prescribed by law and Board Policy and Administrative Regulation. Gray shall perform such duties and responsibilities at a professional level of competence and with due diligence.

#### 4. OUTSIDE PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES

Gray shall devote all or substantially all of his time and attention during the District's normal business hours to performing his duties as Assistant Superintendent of Student Support Services. Upon prior written authorization from the Superintendent, Gray may undertake outside approved professional activities; including consulting, speaking, and writing, which do not conflict with Gray' employment with the District. Time spent performing such outside professional activities shall be charged to vacation leave and shall not interfere with Gray' job performance as Assistant Superintendent of Student Support Services. Subject to approval of the Superintendent, the Assistant Superintendent shall attend meetings at the local, state, and national levels, and shall join professional and service organizations and associations, with expenses being reimbursed by the District.

#### 5. PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES

The Superintendent may meet with Gray and establish Gray' performance objectives under this Agreement.

#### 6. EVALUATION

The Superintendent shall annually evaluate the performance of the Assistant Superintendent. This evaluation shall be based on the position's job description and any mutually agreed upon District goals and objectives, which shall be jointly developed by the Superintendent and the Assistant Superintendent. The Superintendent may use the District-approved management evaluation system as the tool for the evaluation process. The evaluation will include a statement of whether or not the evaluation is deemed to be positive, and shall be placed in the Assistant Superintendent's personnel file. Should the annual evaluation not be completed by June 30th, then the performance by Assistant Superintendent shall be deemed satisfactory for purposes of this Agreement and any entitlement under this Agreement.

#### 7. <u>SICK LEAVE</u>

Gray shall earn sick leave as provided by state law and Board policy. Gray will be provided credit for all accumulated sick leave per Education Code section 44963.

#### 8. FRINGE BENEFITS

Gray shall receive all employment benefits granted to the District's certificated employees that are not otherwise provided in this Agreement; provided, however, that Gray shall be provided a term life insurance policy of \$100,000.00 in lieu of the life insurance benefit provided other employees. The Assistant Superintendent will be provided with health benefits upon retirement from the District after June 20, 2023 until age 65, subject to the limitations set forth in Paragraph 16 herein. These health benefits shall be consistent with that provided to other management employees at the time of retirement. All District contributions toward retiree health insurance benefits and all District costs shall cease when Assistant Superintendent attains age sixty-five (65). If the Assistant Superintendent uses this benefit, the Assistant Superintendent shall be responsible to pay all co-pays, deductibles, and other costs in the same manner as other retired management employees.

#### 9. CAR ALLOWANCE AND REIMBURSEMENT OF BUSINESS EXPENSES

Gray shall be provided a Three Hundred Fifty and 00/100 Dollars (\$350.00) monthly car allowance to cover the cost of transportation expenses incurred in the connection with District business in lieu of any Board policy or directive with respect to transportation reimbursement. Gray shall not receive any other car or mileage allowance from the District.

The District shall reimburse the Assistant Superintendent for actual and necessary expenses incurred by the Assistant Superintendent within the scope of his employment (except for mileage reimbursement within Orange County) so long as such expenses are permitted by the District policy or incurred with approval of the Board. For reimbursement, the Assistant Superintendent shall submit and complete expense claims in writing in accordance with the District's policies, rules, and regulations. The Assistant Superintendent's expense claims shall be supported by appropriate written documentation verifying the contents of the report prior to authorization for reimbursement.

#### 10. <u>SERVICE YEAR</u>

Gray shall be required to render two hundred twenty-four (224) days of full regular service to the District, with the exception of sick leave and other approved leaves, during each annual period covered by this Contract.

#### 11. VACATION

Gray shall be entitled to twenty-four (24) working days of annual vacation, with pay, in addition to holidays as defined in sections 37220 and 37222 of the California Education Code. Gray shall follow all District policies respecting use and accrual of vacation days, including any caps on vacation accrual. Vacation shall be taken after consultation with and approval by the Superintendent. A maximum of ten (10) days of earned vacation may be carried over from one year to the next. Vacation shall be taken during the current or next succeeding year after accrual. In the event of termination or conclusion of employment with the District, Gray shall be compensated for all accrued and unused vacation at Gray' then current daily salary rate.

#### 12. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>

Board agrees that it shall defend, hold harmless and indemnify Assistant Superintendent from any and all demands, claims, duties, actions, and legal proceedings brought against Assistant Superintendent in his individual capacity for any acts arising out of his employment or in his official capacity as agent and employee of District as permitted by law, except for civil, criminal or administrative actions initiated by the Board itself, provided that Assistant Superintendent did not act or fail to act because of actual fraud, corruption or malice.

#### 13. APPLICABLE LAW

This Agreement is subject to all applicable laws and regulations of the State of California, State Board of Education, and District (including District rules, regulations and policies), all of which are made a part of the terms and conditions of this Agreement as though set forth herein.

#### 14. TERMINATION DURING TERM OF AGREEMENT

- A. <u>Cause</u>. The District may terminate this Agreement for any of the grounds enumerated in California Education Code sections 44932 or 44933. In the event the District intends to terminate this Agreement for cause during the term of the Agreement, Gray shall have the right to receive notice of the reasons for the possible termination and shall be given an opportunity to address the Board regarding the reasons for the termination, prior to the District taking action to terminate the Agreement. Gray shall be entitled to counsel, at his own expense, at the conference with the Board to respond to the grounds for Gray' possible termination.
- **B.** Physical or Mental Impairment. Should Gray have difficulty performing the essential functions of his position due to a disability, the District and Gray shall enter into the interactive process to determine if a reasonable accommodation can be provided by the District so that he can perform the essential functions of his job without undue hardship to the District. If it is determined that no accommodation can be made without undue hardship, the District may terminate this Agreement. It is the intent of the District pursuant to this paragraph to comply with the intent and spirit of the Americans with Disabilities Act, as amended, and its California counterpart. Technical terms in this paragraph are to be defined under applicable law.
- C. <u>Death</u>. The death of Gray terminates this Agreement immediately. In such event, all salary and other monetary amounts due to Gray at the time of death shall be paid to Gray' estate.

- **D.** <u>Mutual Consent</u>. This Agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual consent of the District and Gray.
- E. <u>Unilateral Termination by Gray</u>. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, Gray shall have the option to terminate this Agreement by providing the District with written notice of intent to terminate. This notice shall be provided no less than sixty (60) calendar days prior to termination. Gray and the Superintendent may agree in writing to a termination notice of less than sixty (60) calendar days.
- **F.** <u>Notification Upon Seeking Other Employment</u>. Gray shall notify the Superintendent within ten (10) days of being notified that he is a finalist candidate for other employment.
- G. Unilateral Termination by the District. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, the District, at its sole discretion, shall, upon forty-five (45) calendar days' written notice, have the option of terminating this Agreement for any reason (i.e., without cause or a hearing). If the District elects to terminate the Agreement without cause, it shall pay Gray a lump sum payment within thirty (30) days Gray' last day of employment with the District an amount equal to: (i) the salary of the remainder of the term of this Agreement, or any extension thereof; or (ii) an amount equal to the monthly salary of Gray multiplied by twelve (12) months, whichever amount is lesser. The calculation for purposes of the lump-sum payment shall be based upon the rate of salary in effect on the last day of Gray' employment with the District. Upon termination of this Agreement without cause, the District shall continue to pay Gray' health benefits for the remainder of this Agreement, or any extension thereof, not to exceed twelve (12) months, or until Gray finds other public employment, whichever occurs first. This provision is intended to comply with the requirements governing maximum cash settlement as set forth in Government Code sections 53260, et seq. In addition, pursuant to California Government Code sections 53243 and 53243.2, if this Agreement is terminated, any cash settlement related to the termination that Gray may receive from the District shall be fully reimbursed by Gray to the District if Gray is convicted of a crime involving an abuse of his office or position as defined in Government Code section 53243.4.

#### 15. MODIFICATION, TERMINATION, & EXPIRATION OF AGREEMENT

The parties may also modify or terminate this Agreement by mutual consent, in writing, in accordance with California Education Code section 35031.

# 16. <u>LIMITATIONS ON CASH SETTLEMENTS</u>

The provisions of California Government Code sections 53260 et seq. apply to this Agreement. Specifically, in the event this Agreement is terminated and the termination is challenged as being unlawful, the maximum cash settlement that Gray may receive shall be an amount equal to the monthly salary of Gray multiplied by the number of months left on the unexpired term of the Agreement. However, if the unexpired term of the Agreement is greater than twelve (12) months, the maximum cash settlement shall be an amount equal to the monthly salary multiplied by twelve (12). In addition, pursuant to California Government Code section 53243, if this Agreement is terminated, any cash settlement related to the termination that Gray may receive from the District shall be fully reimbursed to the District if Gray is convicted of a crime involving an abuse of his office or position.

### 17. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- **A.** <u>Severability</u>. If any term or provision of this Agreement shall, to the extent, be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining terms and provisions of the Agreement shall continue in effect.
- **B.** <u>Construction</u>. This Agreement shall not be construed more strongly against either party regardless of who is responsible for its preparation.
- **C.** <u>Modification</u>. This Agreement cannot be changed or supplemented orally. It may be modified or superseded only by a written instrument executed by both parties.
- **D.** Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties. There are no oral understandings, terms, or conditions, and neither party has relied upon any representation, expressed or implied, not contained in these documents. All prior understanding, terms, or conditions are deemed merged into these documents. This Agreement is intended to supersede all prior agreements and addenda.
- **E.** Enforcement. This Agreement is entered into and shall be subject to, construed, and governed by the laws of the State of California. The parties also agree that, in the event of litigation, venue shall be the appropriate state court located in Orange County, California.
- **F.** <u>Non-Assignment</u>. This is an Agreement for personal services. The Assistant Superintendent shall have neither the right nor the power to transfer any rights under this Agreement.
- **G.** <u>Board Approval</u>. The parties agree that the effectiveness of this Agreement is contingent upon approval by the District's Governing Board and the signature of the Assistant Superintendent.
- **H.** <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall be for the benefit of and shall be binding upon all parties and their respective successors, heirs and assigns.
- I. <u>Execution of Other Documents</u>. All parties to this Agreement shall cooperate fully in the execution of any other documents and in the completion of any additional actions that may be necessary or appropriate to give full force and effect to the terms of this Agreement.
- **J.** Exclusivity. To the maximum extent permitted by law, the parties agree that the employment relationship between the District and the Assistant Superintendent shall be governed exclusively by the provisions of this Agreement and not by Board policies, administrative regulations, management handbooks or similar documents.
- **K.** <u>Management Hours</u>. The parties recognize that the demands of the position will require the Assistant Superintendent to average more than eight (8) hours a day, five (5) days per week, and/or more than forty (40) hours per week. The parties agree that the Assistant Superintendent shall not be entitled to overtime compensation.
- L. <u>Independent Review</u>. The Parties have had the opportunity to obtain, and have obtained, independent legal or other professional advice with regard to this Agreement, including tax and retirement

consequences. The Parties acknowledge that the terms of this Agreement have been read and fully explained and that those terms are fully understood and voluntarily accepted.

- M. <u>Execution</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Photographic copies of such signed counterparts may be used in lieu of the originals for any purpose.
- **N.** <u>Public Record</u>. The parties recognize that, once final, this Agreement is a public record and must be made available to the public upon request.
- **O.** <u>Waiver</u>. Any waiver of any breach of any term or provision of this Agreement shall be in writing and shall not be construed to be a waiver of any other breach of this Agreement.

**IN WITNESS WHEREOF**, the parties hereto have duly approved and executed this Agreement.

I, Renee Gray, hereby accept this offer of employment and agree to comply with each and every condition thereof, and to perform faithfully all of the duties and responsibilities of the position of Assistant Superintendent of Student Support Services for the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District.

#### **ENCROACHMENT AGREEMENTS**

## **Background**

Southern California Edison (SCE) has five easements located on Bernardo Yorba Middle School property on the eastern property line between the middle school and Lupine Street. All previous easements were recorded in 1966 and 1971. Over time, three of the property owners have encroached onto the Bernardo Yorba property and into the SCE easement.

For several months, SCE has worked with the three homeowners and the district to obtain an encroachment agreement between all three parties. This agreement will allow SCE to continue the right-of-way easement for electric transmission lines along the property line. The encroachment agreement allows the property owners to reasonably maintain the encroachments on the district's property and confirms that the district does not own any of the encroachments and, therefore, is not responsible for the status of the encroachments or their condition.

Within the terms of the agreement, SCE will be responsible for giving notice to the homeowners if so required, for the removal of the encroachments, or any part thereof, to facilitate the construction, reconstruction, operation, repair, alternation or maintenance on the easement.

Legal counsel has reviewed the encroachment agreement, found the agreement acceptable, and recommends the contract between SCE, the three homeowners, and the district for approval.

This AGREEMENT ("Encroachment Agreement"), dated the 22 day of 20.23, is entered by and between SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY, a corporation, for itself and on behalf of its successors and assigns, ("Grantor"), PLACENTIA YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT OF ORANGE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA ("Grantee"), and BRUCE J. ANDERSON AND LINDA ANDERSON, TRUSTEES OF THE BRUCE & LINDA ANDERSON FAMILY TRUST, dated July 31, 2004 (the "Property Owner").

#### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Property Owner owns property adjacent to the Property located at: Lot 38 of Tract No. 7895, in the City of Yorba Linda, Orange County, State of California, as shown on map recorded in Book 361, Pages 11 through 13, Inclusive of miscellaneous maps, in the Office of the County Recorders of said County, also identified as Assessor's Parcel No. 349-461-07.

WHEREAS, Grantor, Grantee, and the Property Owner (collectively, the "Parties" and individually, a "Party") hereby recognize the current existence of various encroachments located on the Easement resulting from the Property Owner's activities or property, depicted on the map attached hereto as Exhibit "A" block wall, concrete landing, stairs, ornamental row of bushes, trees, wrought-iron fencing/gate (collectively the "Encroachments").

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to enter into this Encroachment Agreement to establish the rights and obligations of the Parties with respect to the Encroachments.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants herein contained, it is agreed by the Parties on their own behalf and on behalf of their successors and assigns as follows:

- 1. The Parties hereby confirm that Grantee does not own any of the Encroachments and therefore, is not responsible for the status of the Encroachments or their condition. However, in exchange for the consideration set forth herein, Grantee shall allow the Property Owner to reasonably maintain the Encroachments on the Property, subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein.
- 2. Grantor agrees to interpose no objection to the Encroachments and shall take no adverse action with respect to the Grantee's ownership of the Property, subject to Property Owner's compliance with the terms and conditions set forth herein.
- 3. The Property Owner may continue to maintain the Encroachments, from the date hereof and thereafter until such time as Grantor, in its sole discretion, shall require the removal of the Encroachments, or any part thereof, as it deems necessary or convenient, to facilitate the construction, reconstruction, operation, repair, alteration, or maintenance of its facilities now or hereafter constructed on the Easement in which case Grantor shall comply with the notice requirements and procedures set forth in Section 4 below. Grantor's actions shall comply with the requirements of the Grant of Easement and this agreement shall in no way be construed as expanding or changing Grantor's easement rights as set forth in the Grant of Easement.
- 4. In the event Grantor shall so require the removal of the Encroachments, or any part thereof, Grantor shall send written notice to the Property Owner and the Grantee (the "Removal Notice"). Upon receipt of the Removal Notice, Grantor shall request a meeting between the Parties to discuss the Removal Notice. Upon Grantor's meeting request, the Parties shall work in good faith to address the Grantor's concerns. The Grantee may require the Property Owner to remove the Encroachments, or any part thereof, if the Grantor determines that such Encroachments are preventing the Grantor from using the Easement as intended in the Grant of Easement.
- 5. Upon receipt of the Removal Notice, Property Owner shall remove the specified Encroachments described in the Removal Notice within sixty (60) days after receiving the Removal Notice. Property Owner shall complete the specified Encroachments removal in accordance with the Removal Notice and shall return the Property to the condition surrounding the Encroachments. Should the Property Owner fail to so remove the specified Encroachments within said period of sixty (60) days, Grantor may forthwith remove said encroachments, or such part thereof as may be specified in the Removal Notice, and restore the Property to the condition surrounding the Encroachments, at the sole

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expense and risk of the Property Owner. Grantee shall work in good faith with the Grantor to ensure the Grantor has access to the Property to remove the specified Encroachments.

- 6. As a part of the consideration for the execution of this Encroachment Agreement by Grantor, Grantee and the Property Owner further agree not to construct, place or maintain any other encroachment of any kind, other than those hereinabove particularly referred to and described or permitted pursuant to the explicit terms of the Grant of Easement, anywhere on the said right of way of Grantor.
- 7. Grantee and Property Owner recognize the easement rights of Grantor in and to the Property as set forth in the Grant of Easement.
- 8. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Property Owner agrees to defend, indemnify, protect and save harmless Grantor and Grantee from and against any action, assessment, count, citation, claim, demand, judgment, loss, damage, liability (legal, administrative, or otherwise), notice, fine, penalty, proceeding, responsibility, violation, attorney's and consultant's fees, causes of action, cost, charge, or expense arising from the death of or injury to any persons or from damage to any property by reason of the maintenance, operation, use or presence of the Encroachments upon the Property, including any activity to remove or adjust the Encroachments.
- 9. In the event Property Owner shall fail or refuse to comply with and perform each and all of the covenants contained herein, this Encroachment Agreement and all privileges hereby given shall, at the option of Grantor, cease and terminate, and Grantor shall have the right forthwith to remove the Encroachments from the Property at the sole expense and risk of the Property Owner upon consultation with the Grantee.
- 10. Upon termination or reversion of the rights herein granted, Property Owner shall execute and deliver to Grantee, within thirty (30) days after service of a written demand therefore, a good and sufficient quitclaim deed releasing its rights to encroach upon or use the Property as established by this Encroachment Agreement. Should Property Owner fail or refuse to deliver to Grantee a quitclaim deed, as aforesaid, a written notice by Grantee reciting the failure or refusal of Property Owner to execute and deliver said quitclaim deed as herein provided and terminating this Encroachment Agreement shall, after ten (10) days from the date of recordation of said notice, be conclusive evidence against Property Owner and all persons claiming under Property Owner of the termination or reversion of the rights herein given.
- 11. In no event shall Grantee be responsible or liable for the Encroachments or for any requirement or obligation assigned to the Property Owner through this Encroachment Agreement. 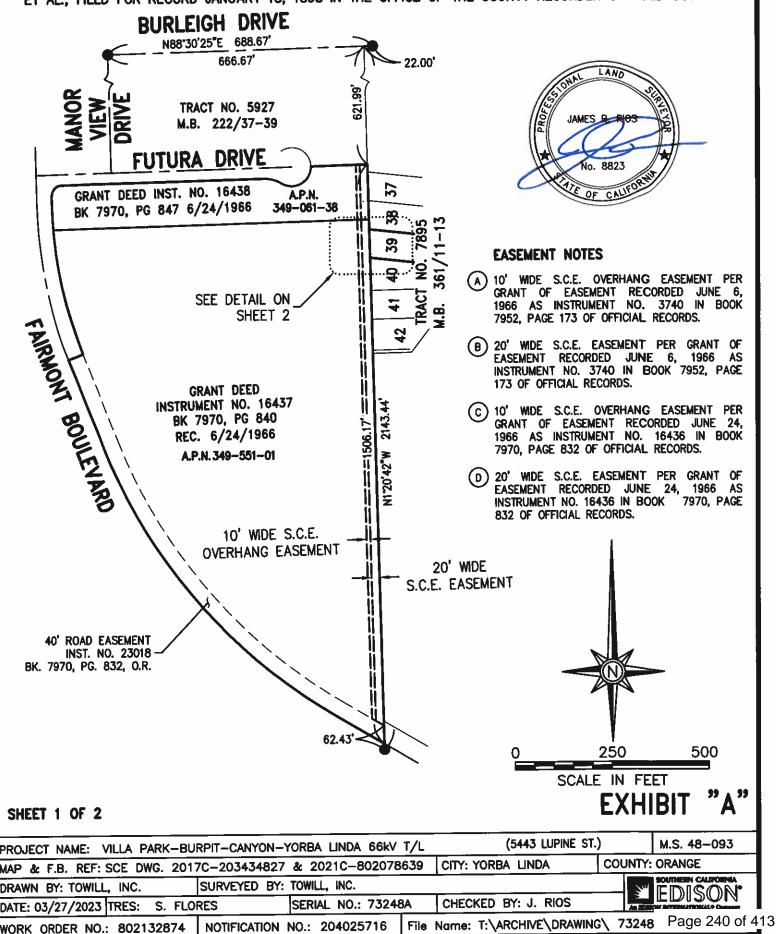

# AGREEMENT FOR CONSULTANT SERVICES

This AGREEMENT is made and entered into this <u>17<sup>th</sup></u> day of <u>January 2024</u>, by and between the <u>PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT</u>, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT", and <u>J S EASTERDAY CONSTRUCTION, INC.</u>, hereinafter referred to as "CONSULTANT".

WHEREAS, DISTRICT desires to obtain consultant services for the CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT SERVICES FOR VARIOUS PROJECTS DISTRICT-WIDE, hereinafter referred to as "PROJECT", located in the DISTRICT; and

WHEREAS, CONSULTANT is fully licensed, if required, to provide such special consultant services in conformity with the laws of the State of California;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

## ARTICLE I – CONSULTANT'S SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. CONSULTANT's services shall consist of those services performed by CONSULTANT, CONSULTANT's employees and CONSULTANT's consultants as enumerated in this AGREEMENT.
- 2. CONSULTANT's services shall be performed in a manner that is consistent with professional skill and care and the orderly progress of the work. CONSULTANT represents that he/she will follow the standards of his/her profession in performing all services under this AGREEMENT.
- 3. CONSULTANT, upon notice to proceed from the DISTRICT, shall provide the DISTRICT certain special services and advice relating to the PROJECT. The nature of such special services and advice is more particularly set forth in the CONSULTANT's proposal that is part of Attachment "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference only as it relates to the services to be provided by the CONSULTANT. All other terms and conditions shall be governed by this AGREEMENT. Any terms, general conditions, or other boilerplate terms or documents in the CONSULTANT's proposal shall not be incorporated into this AGREEMENT unless specifically agreed upon by the DISTRICT in writing. Any conflicts, discrepancies, ambiguities or other inconsistencies between this AGREEMENT and the CONSULTANT's proposal shall be governed by and interpreted in favor of this AGREEMENT.
- 4. If applicable, the CONSULTANT shall comply with any applicable prevailing wage and related requirements for the PROJECT. If applicable, the CONSULTANT shall be properly registered with the Department of Industrial Relations and qualified to perform public works in accordance with Labor Code sections 1725.5 and 1771.1 at all times during the term of

this AGREEMENT.

## **ARTICLE II - TERMINATION**

- 1. This AGREEMENT may be terminated by either party upon fourteen (14) days' written notice to the other party in the event of a substantial failure of performance by such other party, including insolvency of CONSULTANT; or if the DISTRICT should decide to abandon or indefinitely postpone the PROJECT.
- 2. In the event of a termination based upon abandonment or postponement by DISTRICT the DISTRICT shall pay CONSULTANT for all services performed and all expenses incurred under this AGREEMENT supported by documentary evidence, including payroll records, and expense reports up until the date of the abandonment or postponement plus any sums due the CONSULTANT for Board approved extra services. In ascertaining the services actually rendered hereunder up to the date of termination of this AGREEMENT, consideration shall be given to both completed work and work in process of completion and to complete and incomplete drawings and other documents whether delivered to the DISTRICT or in the possession of the CONSULTANT. In the event termination is for a substantial failure of performance, all damages and costs associated with the termination, including increased consultant and replacement consultant costs shall be deducted from payments to CONSULTANT.
- This AGREEMENT may be terminated without cause by DISTRICT upon fourteen (14) days' written notice to CONSULTANT. In the event of a termination without cause, the DISTRICT shall pay CONSULTANT for all services performed and all expenses incurred under this AGREEMENT supported by documentary evidence, including payroll records, and expense reports up until the date of notice of termination plus any sums due the CONSULTANT for Board approved extra services. In ascertaining the services actually rendered hereunder up to the date of termination of this AGREEMENT, consideration shall be given to both completed work and work in process of completion and to other documents whether delivered to the DISTRICT or in the possession of the CONSULTANT. In addition, CONSULTANT will be reimbursed for reasonable termination costs through the payment of no more than 3% beyond the sum due the CONSULTANT under this paragraph through 50% completion of CONSULTANT's portion of the project and if 50% completion is reached, payment of up to 3% of the unpaid balance of the contract to CONSULTANT as termination cost upon provision of substantiating justification documents. This payment is agreed to compensate CONSULTANT for the unpaid profit CONSULTANT would have made under the project on the date of termination and is consideration for entry into this termination for convenience clause.
- 4. In the event of a dispute between the parties as to performance of the work or the interpretation of this AGREEMENT, or payment or nonpayment for work performed or not performed, the parties shall attempt to resolve the dispute. Pending resolution of this dispute, CONSULTANT agrees to continue the work diligently to completion. If the dispute is not resolved, CONSULTANT agrees it will neither rescind the AGREEMENT nor stop the progress of the work, but CONSULTANT's sole remedy shall be to submit such controversy to determination by a court having competent jurisdiction of the dispute, after the Project has been

completed, and not before.

## <u>ARTICLE III – CONSULTANT'S DRAWINGS AND SPECIFICATIONS</u>

Any and all drawings, specifications and other documents prepared by CONSULTANT or CONSULTANT's Consultants for this PROJECT shall be and remain the property of the DISTRICT.

## ARTICLE IV - ACCOUNTING RECORDS OF CONSULTANT

Records of CONSULTANT's direct personnel and reimbursable expenses pertaining to any extra services for this PROJECT, and records of accounts between the DISTRICT and CONSULTANT shall be kept on a generally recognized accounting basis and shall be available to the DISTRICT or DISTRICT's authorized representative at mutually convenient times.

## **ARTICLE V - COMPENSATION TO CONSULTANT**

- 1. The DISTRICT shall compensate CONSULTANT as follows:
  - a. As set forth in Attachment "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference
  - b. Reimbursable expenses that are in addition to compensation for basic and extra services, and shall be paid to CONSULTANT at one and one-tenth (1.1) times the expenses incurred by CONSULTANT, CONSULTANT's employees and consultants for:
    - (1) Fees advanced for securing approval of authorities having jurisdiction over the project.
    - (2) Reimbursable expenses are estimated to be \$0.00 and this amount shall not be exceeded without the prior written approval of the DISTRICT.

## **ARTICLE VI - MISCELLANEOUS**

- 1. To the fullest extent permitted by law, CONSULTANT agrees to indemnify, defend and hold DISTRICT entirely harmless from all liability arising out of:
  - a. Any and all claims under Workers' Compensation acts and other employee benefit acts with respect to CONSULTANT's employees or CONSULTANT's consultants employees arising out of CONSULTANT's work under this AGREEMENT; and

- b. Liability for damages for (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; (3) any failure or alleged failure to comply with any provision of law or (4) any other loss, damage or expense arising under either (1), (2), or (3) above, sustained by CONSULTANT or any person, firm or corporation employed by CONSULTANT upon or in connection with the PROJECT, except for liability resulting from the sole or active negligence, or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT, its officers, employees, agents or independent consultants who are directly employed by the DISTRICT;
- c. Any loss, injury to or death or persons or damage to property caused by any act, neglect, default or omission of CONSULTANT, or any person, firm or corporation employed by CONSULTANT, either directly or by independent contract, including all damages due to loss or theft, sustained by any person, firm or corporation including the DISTRICT, arising out of, or in any way connected with the PROJECT, including injury or damage either on or off DISTRICT property; but not for any loss, injury, death or damages caused by the sole or active negligence, or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT.

CONSULTANT, at its own expense, cost, and risk, shall defend any and all claims, actions, suits, or other proceedings that may be brought or instituted against the DISTRICT, its officers, agents or employees, on any such claim or liability, and shall pay or satisfy and judgment that may be rendered against the DISTRICT, its officers, agents or employees in any action, suit or other proceedings as a result thereof.

- 2. CONSULTANT shall purchase and maintain policies of insurance with an insurer or insurers, qualified to do business in the State of California and acceptable to DISTRICT which will protect CONSULTANT and DISTRICT from claims which may arise out of or result from CONSULTANT's actions or inactions relating to the AGREEMENT, whether such actions or inactions be by themselves or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or by anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable. The aforementioned insurance shall include coverage for:
  - a. Workers' Compensation and Employers Liability Insurance in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
  - b. Comprehensive general liability insurance with limits of not less than TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000.00) and automobile liability insurance with limits not less than ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00) for bodily injury and property damage liability per occurrence, including:
    - 1. Owned, non-owned and hired vehicles at cash value;
    - 2. Blanket contractual;
    - 3. Broad form property damage;

- 4. Products/completed operations; and
- 5. Personal injury.
- c. If this AGREEMENT is for architectural or engineering services, professional liability insurance, including contractual liability, with limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence. Such insurance shall be maintained during the term of this AGREEMENT and renewed for a reasonable period of time. In the event that CONSULTANT subcontracts any portion of CONSULTANT's duties, CONSULTANT shall require any such subcontractor to purchase and maintain insurance coverage as provided in this subparagraph. Failure to maintain professional liability insurance is a material breach of this AGREEMENT and grounds for immediate termination.
- Each policy of insurance required in (b) above shall name DISTRICT and d. its officers, agents and employees as additional insureds; shall state that, with respect to the operations of CONSULTANT hereunder, such policy is primary and any insurance carried by DISTRICT is excess and non-contributory with such primary insurance; shall state that not less than thirty (30) days' written notice shall be given to DISTRICT prior to cancellation; and, shall waive all rights of subrogation. CONSULTANT shall notify DISTRICT in the event of material change in, or failure to renew, each policy. Prior to commencing work, CONSULTANT shall deliver to DISTRICT certificates of insurance as evidence of compliance with the requirements herein. In the event CONSULTANT fails to secure or maintain any policy of insurance required hereby, DISTRICT may, at its sole discretion, secure such policy of insurance in the name of and for the account of CONSULTANT, and in such event CONSULTANT shall reimburse DISTRICT upon demand for the cost thereof.
- 3. CONSULTANT, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONSULTANT understands and agrees that CONSULTANT and all of CONSULTANT's employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONSULTANT assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of CONSULTANT's employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONSULTANT shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes for the respective CONSULTANT's employees.
- 4. Nothing contained in this AGREEMENT shall create a contractual relationship with or a cause of action in favor of any third party against either the DISTRICT or CONSULTANT.
  - 5. The DISTRICT and CONSULTANT, respectively, bind themselves, their

partners, officers, successors, assigns and legal representatives to the other party to this AGREEMENT with respect to the terms of this AGREEMENT. CONSULTANT shall not assign this AGREEMENT.

- 6. This AGREEMENT shall be governed by the laws of the State of California.
- 7. This AGREEMENT represents the entire AGREEMENT between the DISTRICT and CONSULTANT and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral. This AGREEMENT may be amended or modified only by an agreement in writing signed by both the DISTRICT and CONSULTANT.

## LICENSE AGREEMENT BETWEEN

## PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

#### **AND**

## SECO ELECTRIC & LIGHTING, INC.

### FOR THE USE OF REAL PROPERTY

THIS LICENSE AGREEMENT ("License") is approved and entered into as of this 1st day of January, 2024 ("Effective Date"), by and between the PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, a California public school district duly organized and existing under Chapter 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Education Code of the State of California (the "LICENSOR") and SECO ELECTRIC & LIGHTING, INC., a California Corporation (the "LICENSEE").

## **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, LICENSOR is the owner of certain real property located at 4999 Casa Loma Ave., Yorba Linda, CA 92886, a portion of which includes storage, office space and parking as more particularly described in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, LICENSEE is seeking space for storage and office use and desires the use of the Property described in Exhibit "A" for this purpose; and

WHEREAS, LICENSOR is willing to grant to LICENSEE this License for the non-exclusive use of the Property designated in Exhibit "A" in accordance with the terms and conditions of this License; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire by this License to provide for the terms and conditions for the use of the Property.

## **AGREEMENT**

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto for the consideration hereinafter expressed, covenant and agree as follows:

## Section 1. Grant of License and Use of Property

(a) <u>Grant of License and Use of Property</u>. In consideration of the License Fee, LICENSOR grants a non-exclusive license to LICENSEE to use the Property for the limited purposes of using storage and office space.

## Section 2. <u>License Fee; Deposit</u>.

- (a) <u>License Fee</u>. LICENSEE shall pay a fee of THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,000.00) as a License Fee for the use of the Property per month. The first payment is due upon execution of this Agreement and subsequent payments are due on or before the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month.
- Section 3. <u>Term.</u> Subject to Section 6 of this License, the term of this License shall be one (5) year ("Term"), unless mutually extended in writing by both parties. Either party may, in its sole discretion, terminate this License for any or no reason, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party at the address set forth herein. Upon the expiration or termination of this License, at any time or upon any grounds provided herein, LICENSEE shall immediately vacate the Property, and if requested by the District, restore the Property to its condition as of the Effective Date, at the sole and exclusive cost of LICENSEE.

## Section 4. Conditions to Use.

- (a) <u>Maintenance of Property</u>. LICENSEE shall be responsible for and shall pay for any repairs or replacements of any character whatsoever which are occasioned or are made necessary by reason of the negligence or misuse of the Property by LICENSEE's employees or invitees. LICENSEE shall notify LICENSOR immediately of any damage caused to the Property. In the event that LICENSEE fails to maintain or repair the Property, LICENSOR may, at LICENSOR's sole discretion, undertake any maintenance or repair of the Property and LICENSEE shall reimburse LICENSOR for the costs of such repairs or maintenance within thirty (30) days of invoice by LICENSOR.
- (b) <u>Clean-up of Property</u>. LICENSEE shall be responsible for the full and complete clean up of the Property and any other portion of the Property used by the LICENSEE at the close of each and every day, leaving it in a comparable state as existed prior to the LICENSEE's activities. In the event that LICENSEE fails to clean up and maintain the Property, LICENSOR may, at LICENSOR's sole discretion, undertake any clean up or maintenance of the Property and LICENSEE shall reimburse LICENSOR for the costs of such clean up or maintenance within thirty (30) days of invoice by LICENSOR. Additionally, under no circumstances during the term of this License shall LICENSEE use or cause to be used in the Property any hazardous or toxic substances or materials, and under no circumstance during the term of this License shall LICENSEE store or dispose of any such substances or materials in the Property.
- (c) <u>Non-Interference with District Activities</u>. This License shall not grant LICENSEE the right to interfere with any District activities of LICENSOR.
- (d) <u>Conduct of LICENSEE, Employees and Invitees</u>. LICENSEE shall insure that all employees, invitees, and all others in attendance will adhere to proper standards of public conduct. There is to be no consumption of intoxicating liquors or other

controlled substances, smoking, gambling, quarreling, fighting, use of profane language, or indecent exposure on or near the Property.

(e) <u>Utilities</u>. LICENSEE shall be responsible for payment of all utilities associated with operation of the Property during the periods when LICENSEE has use of the Property. LICENSEE's pro-rata share shall be billed to the LICENSEE each month. Said invoice shall itemize LICENSEE's share of the total costs of utilities for the Property. LICENSEE shall promptly pay to the LICENSOR its share of such utility costs within thirty (30) days of receipt of such invoice.

## (g) <u>Insurance</u>.

- (i) <u>Public Liability and Property Damage</u>. ### AGREEMENT FOR PRODUCTS AND SERVICES

The terms contained herein ("Agreement") constitute a binding agreement by and between Emics, Inc., d/b/a Informed K12, Inc. ("Informed K12"), and Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District ("Customer" or "District") signing up via this Agreement or any subsequent order form, purchase order or other similar document mutually agreed by the parties (collectively, each, an "Order Form"), and is effective as of \_\_01/17/2024 \_\_\_\_\_ (the "Effective Date").

1. <u>Applicability Of This Master Agreement.</u> This Agreement governs: (a) your rights to access and use software made available under a software-as-a-service ("SaaS") delivery model for a term ("Services"); (b) your rights to support and/or maintenance services which you purchase or are otherwise entitled to receive ("Support"); and (c) any professional consulting services ("Consulting Services").

## 2. Services.

- 2.1. Service License Grant. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, Informed K12 hereby grants to District a limited, nonexclusive, non-transferable license to access and use the Service during the Term, solely by the number of forms as set forth on the applicable Order Form, solely for internal and non-commercial purposes, and in accordance with the platform Terms of Use. In the event of a conflict between the Terms of Use and this Agreement, the Agreement shall control. With respect to SaaS Services, District will receive, or Informed K12 will make available for District to receive, all applicable updates, application packs, and releases that Informed K12 makes generally available during the Term. Informed K12 reserves the right to discontinue any Service during the Term for any reason, but in such event Informed K12 will notify District and, as District's sole and exclusive remedy, Informed K12 shall provide a pro rata refund for any unused portion of the Services, as applicable.
- 2.2. Services & Support. As mutually agreed by the parties on any Order Form or in a subsequent or concurrent written and executed Statement of Work ("SOW") to be attached hereto and made a part hereof, Informed K12 will also provide certain consulting services, support, or other similar professional services ("Consulting Services") in addition to the subscription Service. All Consulting Services will be paid in accordance with the applicable SOW. Overages may be charged for additional District usage beyond the applicable limitations.

#### 3. Data and Security.

- 3.1. <u>Customer Data</u>. Informed K12 acknowledges and agrees that District shall own all title to and ownership of the Customer Data. As used herein, "Customer Data" shall mean any proprietary raw data owned by District independent of this Agreement, which District may input into the Service or that Informed K12 may input into the Service on behalf of the District. Customer Data expressly excludes any aggregated and anonymized data to the extent processed by, or resulting as an output of, the Service, which shall be considered Informed K12 Data. District hereby grants to Informed K12 a limited, non-exclusive license, during the Term, to use the Customer Data within the Service in order to perform its obligations herein.
- 3.2. Protection Of Personal Information and Data Security. Both parties agree to uphold their responsibilities under Applicable Data Privacy Laws, including but not limited to in the United States, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment, the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act, and state laws such as the California Consumer Privacy Act and California Privacy Rights Act, as applicable. Informed K12 will implement commercially reasonable technical and organizational measures to ensure an appropriate level of security to protect District Data, including Personal Information, as described in the Informed K12 Privacy Policy.
- 4. <u>Payment Terms</u>. Unless specified otherwise in an additional Order Form or SOW, District shall pay to Informed K12 within 30 days from the Effective Date and in US dollars, the applicable subscription and other fees in the amounts and timing as specified in any Order Form or SOW, or both (the "Fees"). Informed K12 reserves the right to increase the Fees at the end of the Initial Term or during any Renewal Term, by up to a maximum of 5% annually, by delivering written notice to District.
- 5. Term; Termination. The term length shall be from 1/17/2024 through 1/16/2025 (the "Initial Term"). After such initial term, this Agreement may be renewed upon request by the District for successive one-year renewal terms (each, a "Renewal Term" and together with the Initial Term, the "Term"), unless either party opts out by giving written notice to the other party at least 30 days prior to the end of the then current term. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon 30 days prior written notice if the other party has materially breached this Agreement and has not cured the same within the 30-day notice period. Upon any termination of this Agreement, (a) District shall promptly: (i) discontinue all use of the Service; (ii) download and store any necessary data retained on the Service; and (iii) certify in writing to Informed K12 that District has complied with these requirements; (b) Informed K12 shall disengage District's access to the Service, and (c) both parties shall within an agreed upon timeframe, or if no such timeframe exists, within 30 days, return to the other or destroy the other party's Confidential Information.

#### General Warranties.

- 6.1. By Informed K12. Informed K12 warrants to District that, during the Term, the Service shall operate in substantial conformity with the Documentation, and that the Consulting Services, if any, will be performed in a professional and workmanlike manner. The foregoing warranty shall not apply if the non-conformance is not replicable or results from third party systems or components used by District to access the Service, including any lack of interoperability with such third-party systems or components. Informed K12's sole liability and District's sole and exclusive remedy for any breach of the limited warranty set forth above shall be, in Informed K12's sole discretion, to (i) use commercially reasonable efforts to provide an error-correction or work-around for the reported nonconformity, or (ii) terminate this Agreement and refund to District that portion of any prepaid Fee associated with any unused balance of the Term. Informed K12 shall have no obligation with respect to a warranty claim unless notified of such claim promptly and within the Term. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, Informed K12 is not responsible for end user error, errors in inputs or for errors in any Customer Data; Informed K12 does not independently verify the truthfulness or accuracy of any data or content input into the Service and is not responsible for the fraud, misrepresentation, negligence or misconduct of any end user or other third party. Services may be temporarily unavailable for scheduled maintenance or for unscheduled emergency maintenance, either by us or by third-party providers, or because of other causes beyond Informed K12's reasonable control.
- 6.2. By District. District warrants that: (a) District owns or has sufficient rights in and to the Customer Data and District's Authorized Users to use, and permit use of, the Services, including the representations and warranties made above in connection with Proprietary Rights and Personal Information, (b) District will comply with all Laws related to District's use of the Services; and (c) the person executing the Agreement or any Order Form has authority to accept such Order Form and the Agreement on behalf of the District. The person signing specifically has the authority to commit to the payment of fees for excess usage and excess storage, calculated in accordance with this agreement and any relevant order form.
- 7. <u>Customer Indemnification Obligations</u>. District shall indemnify and hold Informed K12 harmless from any costs, expenses, claims, liabilities, judgments, damages or losses, in each case arising out of (i) any breach by District of this Agreement, including any representation, warranty or obligation herein; (ii) the Customer Data or any other content, data or other materials input into the Service, or otherwise provided, by or on behalf of District; (iii) any actual or alleged non-compliance by District with applicable laws and regulations; or (iv) District's actual or alleged violation of third party privacy rights, including without limitation any breach of the scope of the license granted herein.
- 8. Confidential Information. Each party acknowledges that by reason of the relationship created between the parties by this Agreement, it may have access to certain non-public information of substantial value concerning the other party's business, operations, strategic plans, customers, users, suppliers, technology, competition and employees ("Confidential Information"), which value would be impaired if such Confidential Information were disclosed to third parties or used other than for purposes expressly authorized hereunder. Without limiting the foregoing, but for avoidance of doubt, the terms of this Agreement, and any performance, warranty and like information relating to the Service (by whomsoever generated or communicated) will be considered Confidential Information of Informed K12. Accordingly, each party agrees (a) to maintain all Confidential Information received from the other, in whatever form disclosed, in strict confidence, (b) not to disclose or otherwise make available such Confidential Information to any third party without the prior written consent of the disclosing party, and (c) not to use the Confidential Information of the other party except as required in the performance of its obligations or the exercise of its rights hereunder. The foregoing obligations shall not apply to Confidential Information of a disclosing party that, as can be reasonably demonstrated with admissible evidence by the receiving party: (i) is or becomes a matter of public knowledge though no action or omission of the receiving party; (ii) was rightfully in the receiving party's possession without restrictions on use or disclosure prior to its disclosure by the disclosing party; (iii) is rightfully obtained by the receiving party without an obligation of confidentiality from a third party who has no obligation of confidentiality, direct or indirect, to the disclosing party; (iv) is independently developed by the receiving party without reference to the disclosing party's Confidential Information; or (v) is required to be disclosed by a government authority, court or other authorized tribunal, and then only to the extent of such requirement and only after prompt notice of the requirement is given to the disclosing party.

#### 9. General.

- 9.1. Notices. All notices required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be sent by email, hand, overnight courier or mailed by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested. Notices shall be deemed delivered on the date of delivery, if delivery occurs within normal business hours or on the next business day if delivery occurs outside of normal business hours. All communications will be sent to the respective addresses set forth below or to such other address as may be designated by a party by giving written notice to the other party pursuant to this Section.
- 9.2. <u>Assignment</u>. District may not assign this Agreement or any of its licenses, rights or duties under this Agreement, whether by operation of law or otherwise, without the prior written consent of Informed K12. Subject to the previous sentence, the rights and liabilities of the parties hereto will bind and inure to the benefit of their respective successors and assignees. The Services shall at all times be hosted by or on behalf of Informed K12 on a server environment of its' choosing. Informed K12 reserves the right to change the server environment from time to time as it may deem fit, or outsource hosting or other aspects of the Service in its sole discretion, so long as the Service continues to comply with the express requirements of this Agreement.

- 9.3. <u>Waiver</u>. A waiver shall only be deemed to have been made if expressed in writing by the party granting such waiver and shall not be construed as a waiver of future performance of any such term.
- 9.4. <u>Force Majeure</u>. Neither party will be liable for any failure or delay in its performance under this Agreement (or the performance of or access to the Service), other than payment obligations, due to causes that are beyond its reasonable control, including, but not limited to, an act of God, act of civil or military authority, fire, epidemic, flood, earthquake, riot, war, terrorism, sabotage, and governmental action. The delayed party shall: (i) give the other party written notice of such cause promptly; and (ii) use its reasonable efforts to correct such failure or delay.
- 9.5. Entire Agreement; Construction. This Agreement and its Exhibits and Schedules, constitute the entire understanding between the parties, and supersede all prior discussions, representations, understandings, or agreements (including any pre-existing nondisclosure agreement, except as to its surviving terms and with respect to information disclosed under that agreement), whether oral or in writing, between the parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held by a court of law of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect and, to the extent allowed and practicable, the unenforceable provision shall be modified so as to be enforceable consistent with its original intent and economic effect. The headings and captions used in this Agreement are for convenience only, and shall not affect the interpretation of the provisions of this Agreement. The word "including" shall be construed non-exclusively, to mean "including but not limited to." The word "or" shall be construed inclusively, to mean that one or more of the options may occur. This Agreement and any amendment hereto may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and both of which together shall constitute one instrument.
- 9.6. Governing Law and Jurisdiction: Attorneys' Fees. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of Texas without regard to conflict of laws provisions. The federal and state courts sitting in Texas shall have exclusive jurisdiction and venue to adjudicate any dispute arising out of this Agreement, and each party hereto expressly consents to the personal jurisdiction of such courts and waives any objection to venue, including the objection of forum non conveniens. The prevailing party in any action to enforce this Agreement will be entitled to recover its attorneys' fees and costs in connection with such action.
- 9.7. <u>Modifications to Terms</u>. Any modification or amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by each party's authorized representatives. No terms in any purchase order or other document delivered by District shall be deemed to amend the terms of this Agreement and any such additional or inconsistent terms shall be deemed unacceptable to and rejected by Informed K12.

#### 3. Ownership

- a. *Title.* Customer and Licensor agree that Licensor owns all proprietary rights, including patent, copyright, trade secret, trademark and other proprietary rights, in and to the Software and any corrections, bug fixes, enhancements, updates or other modifications, including custom modifications, to the Software, whether made by Licensor or any third party.
- b. *Pupil Records*. All Pupil Records obtained by the Licensor from the Customer continue to be the property of and under control of the Customer. At the Customer's request, all records will be made available by the Licensor to the Customer for the use of distribution to pupils, parents, and legal guardians at the Customer's discretion. a. *Limitations Period.* No arbitration or other action under this Agreement, unless involving death or personal injury, may be brought by either party against the other more than one (1) year after the cause of action arises.

#### 8. No Consequential Damages

a. No Consequential Damages. Licensor shall not be liable to Customer for indirect, special, incidental, exemplary or consequential damages (including, without limitation, lost profits) related to this Agreement or resulting from Customer's use or inability to use the Software, arising from any cause of action whatsoever, including contract, warranty, strict liability, or negligence, even if Licensor has been notified of the possibility of such damages, and that these limitations will apply notwithstanding any failure of essential purpose of this Agreement.

## 9. Limitation on Recovery

a. Limitation on Recovery. Under no circumstances shall the liability of Licensor to Customer exceed the amounts paid by Customer to Licensor under this Agreement, the refund of the License Fee paid by Customer being Customer's sole remedy. Licensor may in its sole discretion provide modifications to keep the Software in substantial conformance with this Agreement, replace the Software, or refund the license fees paid to Licensor.

#### 10. Term and Termination

- a. Effective Date. This Agreement and the license granted hereunder shall take effect on January 17, 2024.
- b. Annual Renewal. This Agreement shall automatically renew January 16, 2025 for an annual fee of \$10,773 per year and each subsequent year, unless terminated as provided below. Upon renewal, the same terms and conditions contained in this Agreement shall apply except that Licensor shall provide Customer with a revised License Fee thirty (30) days before the anniversary date of this Agreement.
- c. Termination. - h. Independent Contractor. ## **Background**

The Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District School Board periodically reviews, revises, and/or develops board policy to ensure compliance with state law and to establish programs and procedures that address student educational needs. Each local education agency is required to establish and maintain board policies and procedures in support of its students.

In accordance with the passage of Assembly Bill 1078 on September 25, 2023, the District proposes the revision of Board Policy 0410 - Non Discrimination In District Programs and Activities; Board Policy 1312.2 - Complaints Concerning Instructional Materials; Board Policy 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures; Board Policy 5145.3 - Non Discrimination/Harassment; and Board Policy 6161.1 - Selection And Evaluation of Instructional Materials. Changes were made in accordance with Education Code sections 202, 2341.1, 243, and 220(a).

This will be a first reading of the revision of the affected board policies under the new legislature. Staff recommends waiving a second reading and approving the revised board policies as presented as all changes made were in order to bring our affected board policies in compliance with new laws.

## NONDISCRIMINATION IN DISTRICT PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES

The Board of Education is committed to providing equal opportunity for all individuals in district programs and activities. District programs, activities, and practices shall be free from unlawful discrimination, including discrimination against an individual or group based on race, color, ancestry, nationality, national origin, ethnic group identification, ethnicity, age, religion, marital or parental status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, genetic information, or immigration status; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics. District programs and activities shall also be free of any racially derogatory or discriminatory school or athletic team names, mascots, or nicknames.

All individuals shall be treated equitably in the receipt of district and school services. Personally identifiable information collected in the implementation of any district program, including, but not limited to, student and family information for the free and reduced-price lunch program, transportation, or any other educational program, shall be used only for the purposes of the program, except when the Superintendent or designee authorizes its use for another purpose in accordance with law. Resources and data collected by the district shall not be used, directly or by others, to compile a list, registry, or database of individuals based on race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, ethnicity, national origin, or immigration status or any other category identified above.

District programs and activities shall be free of any discriminatory use, selection, or rejection of textbooks, instructional materials, library books, or similar educational resources. The use of any textbook, instructional material, supplemental instructional material, or other curriculum for classroom instruction, or any book or other resource in a school library shall not be rejected or prohibited by the Board or district on the basis that it includes a study of the role and contributions of any individual or group consistent with the requirements of Education Code 51204.5 and 60040, unless such study would violate Education Code 51501 or 60044. (Education Code 243)

Annually, the Superintendent or designee shall review District programs and activities to ensure the removal of any derogatory or discriminatory name, image, practice, or other barrier that may unlawfully prevent an individual or group in any of the protected categories stated above from accessing District programs and activities, including the use of facilities. He/she shall take prompt, reasonable actions to remove any identified barrier. The Superintendent or designee shall report his/her findings and recommendations to the Board after each review.

All allegations of unlawful discrimination in district programs and activities shall be investigated and resolved in accordance with the procedures specified in AR 1312.3 – Uniform Complaint Procedures.

The Superintendent or designee shall notify students, parents/guardians, employees, employee organizations, applicants for admission and employment, and sources of referral for applicants about the District's policy on nondiscrimination and related complaint procedures. Such notification shall be

included in the annual parental notification distributed pursuant to Education Code 48980 and, as applicable, in each announcement, bulletin, catalog, handbook, application form, or other materials distributed to these groups. As appropriate, such notification shall be posted in district schools and offices, including staff lounges, student government meeting rooms, and other prominent locations and shall be posted on the district's website and, when available, district-supported social media.

In addition, the annual parental notification shall inform parents/guardians of their children's right to a free public education regardless of immigration status or religious beliefs, including information on educational rights issued by the California Attorney General. Alternatively, such information may be provided through any other cost-effective means determined by the Superintendent or designee.

The District's nondiscrimination policy and related informational materials shall be published in a format that parents/guardians can understand. In addition, when 15 percent or more of a school's students speak a single primary language other than English, those materials shall be translated into that other language.

## Access for Individuals with Disabilities

District programs and facilities, viewed in their entirety, shall be in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and any implementing standards and/or regulations. When structural changes to existing district facilities are needed to provide individuals with disabilities access to programs, services, activities, or facilities, the Superintendent or designee shall develop a transition plan that sets forth the steps for completing the changes.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the District provides appropriate auxiliary aids and services when necessary to afford individuals with disabilities equal opportunity to participate in or enjoy the benefits of a service, program, or activity unless such provision would result in a fundamental alteration in the nature of a service, program, or activity or would result in undue administrative or financial burdens. These aids and services may include, but are not limited to, qualified interpreters or readers, assistive listening devices, assistive technologies or other modifications to increase accessibility to district and school websites, note takers, written materials, taped text, and Braille or large print materials.

Individuals with disabilities shall notify the Superintendent or principal if they have a disability that requires special assistance or services. Reasonable notification should be given prior to the school-sponsored function, program, or meeting.

### COMPLAINTS CONCERNING INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

The Board of Education has provided policy and administrative regulations to ensure that careful and thorough processes precede the adoption and/or acquisition of instructional materials. In implementing such policies and in providing such materials, the Board of Education is aware of its responsibilities in relationship to First Amendment constitutional issues, the adopted curriculum, and the morals, values and needs of a diverse district constituency. Diversity of opinion is inherent in a free society. In spite of this diversity, the Board of Education and its staff must reach and implement consensus of judgment in order to provide for the educational needs of students.

It is the policy of the Board of Education that persons having complaints about approved instructional materials or materials recommended for approval seek resolution through informal procedures with the administrator responsible for the program which is using the material. In the event that the complaint cannot be resolved through the informal process, the complainant will be advised of the formal complaint procedure. The complainant will be provided with a copy of this policy, the supporting administrative regulations, and any necessary form(s).

Formal complaints regarding instructional materials must be submitted in writing. A review and disposition will be made in accordance with the administrative regulations which implement this policy.

However, a complaint related to the use or prohibited use of any existing textbook, instructional material, supplemental instructional material, or other curriculum for classroom instruction, or any book or other resource in a school library that alleges unlawful discrimination based on a violation of Education Code 243 shall be filed, investigated, and resolved in accordance with Board Policy 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures.

When deliberating upon challenged materials, the Superintendent, or any designee or committee established by the Superintendent to review the materials, shall consider the degree to which the materials aligned with the criteria for instructional materials as specified in law, Board policy, and administrative regulation. In addition, such deliberations may consider the educational philosophy and vision of the district; the educational suitability of the materials including the manner in which the materials support the curriculum and appropriateness for the student's age; the professional opinions of teachers of the subject and of other competent authorities and/or experts; reviews of the materials by reputable bodies; the stated objectives in using the materials; community standards; the allegations in the complaint, including the extent to which the objections are based on the dislike of ideas contained in the materials; and the impact that keeping or removing the materials would have on student well-being.

The Superintendent, or any designee or committee established by the Superintendent to review the materials, shall not prohibit the continued use of an appropriately adopted textbook, instructional material, supplemental instructional material, or other curriculum for classroom instruction, or any book or other resource in a school library on the basis that it contains inclusive and/or diverse perspectives, as specified in Education Code 243.

If the complainant finds the Superintendent's or review committee's decision unsatisfactory, the complainant may appeal the decision to the Board.

Any challenged instructional material that is reviewed by the district shall not be subject to further reconsideration for 12 months, unless required by law.

Complaints related to the sufficiency of textbooks or instructional materials shall be resolved as specified in Administrative Regulation 1312.4 - Williams Uniform Complaint Procedures.

#### **UNIFORM COMPLAINT PROCEDURES**

The Governing Board recognizes that the district has the primary responsibility to ensure compliance with applicable state and federal laws and regulations governing educational programs. The Board encourages early resolution of complaints whenever possible. To resolve complaints which may require a more formal process, the Board adopts the uniform system of complaint processes specified in 5 CCR 4600-4670 and the accompanying administrative regulation.

### **Complaints Subject to UCP**

The person responsible for receiving Uniform Complaints is the <u>Assistant Superintendent of Student Support Services</u> Executive Director of Instructional Support. The person responsible for investigating complaints and iensuring LEA compliance is the Executive Director of <u>Student Services</u> Curriculum and Instruction.

The compliance officer who receives a complaint may assign another compliance officer to investigate and resolve the complaint. The compliance officer shall promptly notify the complainant and respondent if another compliance officer is assigned to the complaint. In no instance shall a compliance officer be assigned to a complaint in which the compliance officer has a bias or conflict of interest that would prohibit the fair investigation or resolution of the complaint. Any complaint against a compliance officer or that raises a concern about the compliance officer's ability to investigate the complaint fairly and without bias shall be filed with the Superintendent or designee who shall determine how the complaint will be investigated.

The district's uniform complaint procedures (UCP) shall be used to investigate and resolve the following complaints:

- 1. Any complaint alleging district violation of applicable state or federal laws or regulations governing any program subject to the UCP which is offered by the district, including adult education programs; After School Education and Safety programs; agricultural career technical education; federal career technical education; child care and development programs; compensatory education; consolidated categorical aid programs; the federal Every Student Succeeds Act; migrant education; Regional Occupational Centers and Programs; school safety plans; and California State Preschool Programs.
- 2. Any complaint by an individual, an individual's representative, an interested third party, public agency or organization alleging the occurrence of unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying) in district programs and activities, including in those programs or activities funded directly by or that receive or benefit from any state financial assistance, based on the person's actual or perceived characteristics of race or ethnicity, color, ancestry, nationality, national

origin, immigration status, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital status, pregnancy, parental status, physical or mental disability, medical condition, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, gender expression, or genetic information, or any other characteristic identified in Education Code 200 or 220, Government Code 11135, or Penal Code 422.55, or based on the person's association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics

- 3. Any complaint alleging district noncompliance with the requirement to provide reasonable accommodation to a lactating student on school campus to express breast milk, breastfeed an infant child, or address other breastfeeding-related needs of the student
- 4. Any complaint alleging district noncompliance with requirements to provide a pregnant or parenting student the accommodations specified in Education Code 46015, including those related to the provision of parental leave, right of return to the school of previous enrollment or to an alternative education program, if desired, and possible enrollment in school for a fifth year of instruction to enable the student to complete state and Board-imposed graduation requirements
- 5. Any complaint alleging district noncompliance with the prohibition against requiring students to pay fees, deposits, or other charges for participation in educational activities
- 6. Any complaint alleging district noncompliance with applicable requirements of Education Code 52060-52077 related to the implementation of the local control and accountability plan, including the development of a local control funding formula budget overview for parents/guardians
- 7. Any complaint alleging noncompliance with requirements related to the development of a school plan for student achievement or the establishment of a school site council, as required for the consolidated application for specified federal and/or state categorical funding
- 8. Any complaint, by or on behalf of a student who is a foster youth as defined in Education Code 51225.2, alleging district noncompliance with any requirement applicable to the student regarding placement decisions; the responsibilities of the district's educational liaison to the student; the award of credit for coursework satisfactorily completed in another school, district, or country; school or records transfer; or the grant of an exemption from Board-imposed graduation requirements
- 9. Any complaint, by or on behalf of a student who transfers into the district after the second year of high school and is a homeless child or youth as defined in 42 USC 11434a, a former juvenile court school student currently enrolled in the district, a child of a military family as defined in Education Code 49701, or a migrant student as defined in Education Code 54441, or by or on behalf of an immigrant student participating in a newcomer program as defined in Education Code 51225.2 in the third or fourth year of high school, alleging district noncompliance with any requirement applicable to the student regarding the grant of an exemption from Board-imposed graduation requirements
- 10. Any complaint, by or on behalf of a student who is a homeless child or youth as defined in 42 USC 11434a, a former juvenile court school student, a child of a military family as defined in Education Code 49701, a migrant child as defined in Education Code 54441, or a newly arrived immigrant student who is participating in a newcomer program as defined in Education Code 51225.2, alleging district noncompliance with requirements for the award of credit for coursework satisfactorily completed in another school, district, or country

- 11. Any complaint alleging district noncompliance with the requirements of Education Code 51228.1 and 51228.2 that prohibit the assignment of a student in grades 9-12 to a course without educational content for more than one week in any semester or to a course the student has previously satisfactorily completed, without meeting specified conditions
- 12. Any complaint alleging district noncompliance with the physical education instructional minutes requirement
- 13. Complaints regarding the noncompliance of a license-exempt California State Preschool Program (CSPP) with health and safety standards specified in Health and Safety Code 1596.7925 and related state regulations
- 14. Any complaint alleging retaliation against a complainant or other participant in the complaint process or anyone who has acted to uncover or report a violation subject to this policy
- 15. Any complaint alleging noncompliance with law regarding the prohibition against student fees, deposits, and charges or any requirement related to the LCAP may be filed anonymously if the complaint provides evidence, or information leading to evidence, to support an allegation of noncompliance. A complaint about a violation of the prohibition against the charging of unlawful student fees may be filed with the principal of the school or with the Superintendent or designee.

The district shall protect all complainants from retaliation. In investigating complaints, the confidentiality of the parties involved shall be protected as required by law. For any complaint alleging retaliation or unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying), the Superintendent or designee shall keep the identity of the complainant, and/or the subject of the complaint if different from the complainant, confidential when appropriate and as long as the integrity of the complaint process is maintained.

When an allegation that is not subject to UCP is included in a UCP complaint, the district shall refer the non-UCP allegation to the appropriate staff or agency and shall investigate and, if appropriate, resolve the UCP-related allegation(s) through the district's UCP.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide training to district staff to ensure awareness and knowledge of current law and requirements related to UCP, including the steps and timelines specified in this policy and the accompanying administrative regulation.

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain a record of each complaint and subsequent related actions, including steps taken during the investigation and all information required for compliance with 5 CCR 4631 and 4633.

### **Non-UCP Complaints**

Complaints that are not specifically covered pursuant to this UCP Board Policy shall be processed and investigated in accordance with the appropriate Board Policy, and the Complainant shall be notified. In addition, the following complaints shall not be subject to the District's UCP but shall be referred to the specified agency:

1. Any complaint alleging child abuse or neglect shall be referred to the County Department of Social Services Protective Services Division and the appropriate law enforcement agency.

- 2. Any complaint alleging health and safety violations by a child development program shall, for licensed facilities, be referred to the Department of Social Services and shall, for licensing-exempt facilities, be referred to the appropriate Child Development regional administrator.
- 3. Any complaint alleging fraud shall be referred to the Legal, Audits and Compliance Branch of the California Department of Education.

Any complaint alleging employment discrimination or harassment shall be investigated and resolved by the district in accordance with the procedures specified in AR 4030 - Nondiscrimination in Employment, including the right to file the complaint with the California Department of Fair Employment and Housing.

Any complaint related to sufficiency of textbooks or instructional materials, emergency or urgent facilities conditions that pose a threat to the health or safety of students or staff, or teacher vacancies and mis assignments shall be investigated and resolved in accordance with the procedures in AR 1312.4 - Williams Uniform Complaint Procedures

The Uniform Complaint procedures do not apply to complaints regarding child nutrition programs established pursuant to Education Code sections 49490 to 49590, inclusive.

- (1) The federal provisions governing complaints relative to child nutrition programs are 7 Code of Federal Regulations sections 210.19(a)(4), 215.1(a), 220.13(c), 225.11(b), 226.6(n), and 250.15(d).
- Other provisions governing complaints relative to child nutrition programs are found at 5 CCR sections 15580 through 15584.

The Uniform Complaint procedures do not apply to complaints regarding special education programs established pursuant to Education Code sections 56000 to 56865, and 59000 to 59300, inclusive.

- (1) The federal provisions governing complaints relative to special education programs are 34 Code of Federal Regulations sections 300.151 through 300.153.
- (2) Other provisions governing complaints relative to special education are found at 5 CCR sections 3200 through 3205.

# **BOARD POLICY**

### NONDISCRIMINATION/HARASSMENT

The Board of Education of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District is committed to providing a safe school environment that allows all students equal access to and opportunities in the district's academic, extracurricular, and other educational support programs, services, and activities. The Board prohibits, at any district school or school activity, unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, and/or bullying targeted at any student by anyone, based on the student's race, color, ancestry, nationality, national origin, ethnic group identification, ethnicity, age, religion, marital or parental status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, genetic information, or immigration status; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.

This policy shall apply to all acts constituting unlawful discrimination or harassment related to school activity or to school attendance occurring within a district school, and to acts which occur off campus or outside of school-related or school-sponsored activities which have a significantly adverse impact or create a hostile environment at school, and to all acts of the Governing Board and the Superintendent in enacting policies and procedures that govern the district..

Unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, may result from physical, verbal, nonverbal, or written conduct based on any of the categories listed above. Unlawful discrimination also includes the creation of a hostile environment through prohibited conduct that is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it affects a student's ability to participate in or benefit from an educational program or activity; creates an intimidating, threatening, hostile, or offensive educational environment; has the effect of substantially or unreasonably interfering with a student's academic performance; or otherwise adversely affects a student's educational opportunities.

Unlawful discrimination also includes disparate treatment of students based on one of the categories above with respect to the provision of opportunities to participate in school programs or activities or the provision or receipt of educational benefits or services.

The Board also prohibits any form of retaliation against any individual who reports or participates in the reporting of unlawful discrimination, files or participates in the filing of a complaint, or investigates or participates in the investigation of a complaint or report alleging unlawful discrimination. Retaliation complaints shall be investigated and resolved in the same manner as a discrimination complaint.

The Superintendent or designee shall facilitate students' access to the educational program by publicizing the district's nondiscrimination policy and related complaint procedures to students, parents/guardians, and employees. In addition, The Superintendent or designee shall post the district's policies prohibiting discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and bullying and other required information on the district's web

site in a manner that is easily accessible to parents/guardians and students, in accordance with law and the accompanying administrative regulation. He/she shall provide training and information on the scope and use of the policy and complaint procedures and take other measures designed to increase the school community's understanding of the requirements of law related to discrimination. The Superintendent or designee shall regularly review the implementation of the district's nondiscrimination policies and practices and, as necessary, shall take action to remove any identified barrier to student access to or participation in the district's educational program. He/she shall report his/her findings and recommendations to the Board after each review.

Regardless of whether a complainant complies with the writing, timeline, and/or other formal filing requirements. All complaints alleging unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, whether formal, or informal, shall be investigated and if found, prompt action shall be taken to stop the discrimination, prevent recurrence, and address any continuing effect on students.

Students who engage in unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying, in violation of law, Board policy, or administrative regulation shall be subject to appropriate consequence or discipline, which may include suspension or expulsion. Any employee who permits or engages in prohibited discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying, shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

All allegations of unlawful discrimination in district programs and activities shall be brought, investigated, and resolved in accordance with Board Policy 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures.

Any student who feels that he/she is being harassed or who observes an incident of harassment should immediately contact the principal or designee. If a situation involving harassment is not promptly remedied by the principal or his/her designee, a formal complaint alleging discrimination/ harassment on the basis of a protected class can be filed with the district's Compliance Officer in accordance with the Uniform Complaint Procedures set forth in BP 1312.3 and AR 1312.3, and if not on the basis of a protected class, via the district's General Complaint policy and regulation, BP and AR 1312.1.

This policy shall be posted in all schools and offices including student government meeting rooms and the staff lounge.

### Record Keeping

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain a record of all formal complaints of unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, to enable the district to monitor, address, and prevent repetitive prohibited behavior in district schools.

#### SELECTION AND EVALUATION OF INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

#### **Instructional Materials**

The Governing Board desires that district instructional materials, as a whole, present a broad spectrum of knowledge and viewpoints, reflect society's diversity, and enhance the use of multiple teaching strategies and technologies. The Board shall adopt instructional materials based on a determination that such materials are an effective learning resource to help students achieve grade-level competency and that the materials meet criteria specified in law. Textbooks, technology-based materials, and other educational materials shall be aligned with academic content standards and the district's curriculum to ensure that they effectively support the district's adopted courses of study.

The Board shall select instructional materials for use in grades TK-8 that have been approved by the State Board of Education (SBE) or have otherwise been determined to be aligned with the state academic content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code 60605 or the Common Core Standards adopted pursuant to Education Code 60605.8.

The Board shall adopt instructional materials for Grades 9-12 upon determining that the materials meet the criteria specified in law and administrative regulation.

The Board's priority in the selection of instructional materials is to ensure that all students are provided with standards-aligned instructional materials in the core curriculum areas of English/language arts, mathematics, science, and history-social science.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish a process by which instructional materials shall be reviewed for recommendation to the Board. Toward that end, he/she may establish an instructional materials steering committee to evaluate and recommend instructional materials. The review process shall involve teachers in a substantial manner and shall encourage the participation of parents/guardians and community members. In addition, the instructional materials steering committee may include administrators, other staff who have subject-matter expertise, and students as appropriate.

If the district chooses to use instructional materials for grades TK-8 that have not been adopted by the SBE, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that a majority of the participants in the district's review process are classroom teachers who are assigned to the subject area or grade level of the materials. Individuals who participate in the selection or review of instructional materials shall not have a conflict of interest, as defined in administrative regulation, in the materials being reviewed.

The committee shall review instructional materials using criteria provided in law and administrative regulation, and shall provide the Board with documentation supporting its recommendations.

The district initiates a pilot of instructional materials, using a representative sample of classrooms for a specified period of time during a school year, in order to determine how well the materials support the district's curricular goals and academic standards. Feedback from teachers piloting the materials shall be made available to the Board. All materials will be placed on a 30-day public display and Board approval must be obtained prior to final adoption of the recommended materials.

### **Core and Extended Reading Lists**

Basic and supplementary materials which are or may be uniformly issued to students and which are the primary resources of instruction shall be adopted by the Board of Education. This includes the literary works placed on the Core and Extended Reading lists, TK-12. Procedures for selection of materials recommended for adoption shall involve management/supervisory personnel, teachers, specialists, and parents who will serve on the literature review committee (LRC) and abide by the established procedures included in the administrative regulations (AR) for the recommendation of novels. All recommended novels require board approval and parent consent prior to being piloted. All Instructional materials recommended for adoption, including recommended novels for the K-12 Core and extended reading lists shall be placed on public display for 30 days prior to Board action.

### **Supplementary Materials**

Supplementary materials, reference materials, and materials used through individual student selection may be provided and utilized to facilitate instruction. Such materials include but are not limited to library books, reference/research materials, audio-visual materials, charts, maps, globes, models, specimens, and technology software. These materials will be selected and acquired through procedures established by the district and do not require Board adoption.

The Board of Education encourages teachers to use supplementary instructional materials which are, in their professional judgment, relevant to curriculum objectives and compatible with district goals and objectives. By using such materials, teachers can introduce content and instructional strategies that enrich the curriculum, enhance learning, help students make critical judgments, and stimulate their intellectual growth.

In the adoption and/or selection of instructional and supplementary materials, the following factors shall be considered:

- 1. support of the approved curriculum and content of the courses of study
- 2. accuracy of content
- 3. absence of bias and fairness of presentation

- 4. age/grade/subject appropriateness
- 5. motivational and physical characteristics of the materials
- 6. demographic and cultural characteristics and needs of students
- 7. useability by instructional staff
- 8. the fiscal resources of the district
- 9. that all language, both written and spoken, be of the highest quality and reflect community and district standards, and
- 10. promotes good citizenship and American ideals
- 11. aligns with all applicable board policies and approved resolutions

Supplementary instructional materials must also be consistent with criteria developed for the selection and evaluation of other instructional materials. If the teacher is uncertain regarding the use of materials, the teacher shall confer with the principal or designee before using them.

The use of any supplemental instructional material shall not be rejected or prohibited by the Board or district on the basis that it includes a study of the role and contributions of any individual or group consistent with the requirements of Education Code 51204.5 and 60040, unless such study would violate Education Code 51501 or 60044. (Education Code 243)

When using supplementary materials, teachers shall provide appropriate introductory and follow-up activities. In addition, teachers shall ensure that supplementary materials do not supplant the use of adopted texts or teaching activities.

The Superintendent shall establish administrative regulations to implement this policy.

### **Public Hearing on Sufficiency of Instructional Materials**

The Board shall annually conduct one or more public hearings on the sufficiency of the district's instructional materials, including textbooks, technology-based materials, other educational materials, and tests. Technology-based materials include, but are not limited to, software programs, video disks, compact disks, optical disks, video and audio tapes, lesson plans, databases, and the electronic equipment required to make use of those materials by students and teachers as a learning resource. (Education Code 60010, 60119)

The hearing shall be held on or before the end of the eighth week from the first day students attend school for that year. (Education Code 60119)

The Board encourages participation by parents/guardians, teachers, interested community members, and bargaining unit leaders at the hearing. Ten days prior to the hearing, the Superintendent or designee shall post a notice in three public places within the district containing the time, place, and purpose of the hearing. The hearing shall not take place during or immediately following school hours. (Education Code 60119)

At the hearing(s), the Board shall determine, through a resolution, whether each student in each school, including each English learner, has sufficient textbooks or other instructional materials that are aligned to the content standards adopted by SBE and consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by SBE in each of the following subjects: (Education Code 60119)

- 1. Mathematics
- 2. Science
- 3. History-social science
- 4. English language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program
- 5. World language
- 6. Health

The Board shall also determine the availability of science laboratory equipment, as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9-12. (Education Code 60119)

In making these determinations, the Board shall consider whether each student has sufficient textbooks or other instructional materials to use in class and to take home. This does not require that each student have two sets of materials. However, materials shall not be considered sufficient if they are photocopied sheets from only a portion of a textbook or instructional materials copied to address a shortage. (Education Code 60119)

If materials are in a digital format, they shall be considered sufficient as long as each student, at a minimum, has and can access the same materials in the class and to take home as all other students in the same class or course in the district, and has the ability to use and access them at home. (Education Code 60119)

If the Board determines that there are insufficient textbooks or other instructional materials, the district shall provide information to classroom teachers and to the public setting forth, for each school in which an insufficiency exists, the percentage of students who lack sufficient standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials in each subject area and the reasons that each student does not have sufficient textbooks or instructional materials. The Board shall submit a copy of the resolution to the County Superintendent of Schools no later than three business days after the hearing. The Board shall take any action to ensure that each student has sufficient materials within two months of the beginning of the school year in which the determination is made. (Education Code 60119)

In addition, if the County Superintendent, in accordance with Education Code 1240, makes the district aware of a school that does not have sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, the district shall take any action to ensure that each student has sufficient materials within two months of the beginning of the school year.

The degree to which every student has sufficient access to standards-aligned instructional materials shall be included in the district's local control and accountability plan. (Education Code 52060)

### Prohibition Against Refusal to Approve or Prohibit the Use of Specified Instructional Materials

The use of any textbook, instructional material, supplemental instructional material, or other curriculum for classroom instruction, or any book or other resource in a school library shall not be rejected or prohibited by the Board or district on the basis that it includes a study of the role and contributions of any individual or group consistent with the requirements of Education Code 51204.5 and 60040, unless such study would violate Education Code 51501 or 60044. (Education Code 243)

### **Complaints**

Complaints concerning instructional materials shall be handled in accordance with Board Policy 1312.2 - Complaints Concerning Instructional Materials, Board Policy 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures, or Administrative Regulation 1312.4 - Williams Uniform Complaint Procedures, as applicable.

#### TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF AGREEMENT

 INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS: During the term of this Agreement, consultant/contractor shall maintain insurance documentation per the limits and requirements outlined:

**General Liability Insurance:** The contractor/consultant/service provider shall provide the District with a Certificate of Insurance, with a page 2 endorsement, naming the District as an additionally insured for at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate.

Certificate Holder and Additional Insured is Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District

The following verbiage is required in the endorsement: The Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District, it's Board and its officers, agents and employees shall be named an Additional Insured, by separate endorsement. Any insurance maintained by contractor/consultant/ service provider shall be primary and any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the District shall be excess and non-contributing.

Automobile Insurance: The contractor/consultant/service provider shall maintain a minimum of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate. COI must show "All Autos".

Worker's Compensation Insurance: The contractor/consultant/service provider shall maintain a minimum of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, unless the business is a sole proprietorship. Initials\_\_\_\_\_\_.

Professional Consultants, which include, but are not limited to, attorneys, medical providers, dental providers, psychologists, psychiatrists, and physical therapists must provide all insurance shown above AND a minimum of \$3,000,000 per occurance of sexual molestation coverage AND Professional Liability insurance with minimum coverage of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate. - 5. Consultant/contractor acknowledges and agrees that it is the sole responsibility of the consultant/contractor to report as income its compensation received from District and to make the requisite tax filings and payments to the appropriate federal, state, or local tax authority. No part of consultant/contractors compensation shall be subject to withholding by District for the payment of social security, unemployment, or disability insurance or other similar state or federal tax obligations.
- 6. All consultants/contractors who work directly with students shall complete a background check per the requirements in Education Code Section 45125.1 and certify that it will provide a drug-free workplace by performing certain specified acts mandated by Government Code Sections 8350 et seq., the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990. ### **Background**

Start Well is a program developed with the shared goal of improving child behavior and learning outcomes for young children in Orange County. Start Well is a process that works directly with the early learning educators to prevent behaviors that impede learning.

# **Participation & Communication**

**A minimum of one hour per week of support** from the Consultant with the ECE Provider is required to ensure the progression of the collaborative goals.

Provider must provide parents/guardians and staff of a program description and the intent to engage with the Start Well program (document template to be provided by the Consultant) prior to the start of services.

Provider must obtain written, informed consent and permission from the parent, prior to releasing any *individual child* information or conducting individual child observations to the Start Well program. Failure to provide this information will result in immediate termination of services.

ECE leadership members must attend all meetings and actively participate in all aspects of implementation plan. The goal of the Start Well program is to ensure that the leadership team can independently support the staff and families in providing best practices to support all children.

To improve programming, the Start Well program engages in an ongoing outcome and evaluation process through the County of Orange Health Care Agency. Participation in pre/post surveys, informational interviews and/or completing checklists will be necessary by the leadership team, teachers, and/or parents. Information obtained is sent directly to an outside evaluator and only aggregate data is shared with Start Well staff. We value your input and will use the information collected confidentially, to support program improvement.

### **Funding**

The services provided by the Start Well Program is at NO COST to the ECE provider. The Start Well program is funded by Orange County Health Care Agency (OCHCA).

#### **Duration**

This partnership is entirely voluntary, and this document is not intended to be a legal contract. If either the Start Well Program or the ECE Provider wish to end services, a minimum of a two-week notice is requested, in writing to the Director.

It is hereby agreed by and between the <u>Centralia School District</u> (hereinafter referred to a sthe "Provider District") and the <u>Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District</u> (hereafter referred to as the "Sending District,") and collectively referred to herein as the "Parties," mutually agree as follows:

### 1. Basis of Agreement

Pursuant to the authority established in Education Code Sections 56195, 56195.1, 56195.3 and 56195.5, Provider District may provide for the education of individual pupils in special education programs who reside in other districts or counties. The Provider District operates the Regional and Specialized Programs to provide special education programs and services to individuals with exceptional needs requiring intensive educational services, including a regional deaf and hard of hearing program.

### 2. Term of Agreement

This Agreement is effective for the period beginning July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024.

### 3. Acknowledgment of Special Education Funding Formula

It is acknowledged that, in accordance with Part 30 of the Education Code, Chapter 7.2, Section 56836 et seq., the California State funding formula for special education programs, services and administration generates an entitlement based on the average daily attendance of pupils in the local education agencies that comprise a Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA).

### 4. Scope of Program and Referral Process to GASELPA

The Provider District shall conduct special education programs and services for those eligible pupils of the Sending District referred by their Individualized Education Program (IEP) Teams when it is jointly determined by the Sending District and the Provider District that the pupil's educational needs as specified in the pupil's IEP can be appropriately met by the programs and services operated by the Provider District. Prior to offering placement in any Provider District Program, the Sending District shall contact the appropriate Provider District Program Specialist and/or Provider District Director to discuss a possible referral and the appropriateness of the Provider District Program placement. If the referral seems appropriate, the Sending District shall obtain from the parent authorization to release information to the Provider District staff and

submit a Provider District referral packet to the appropriate Provider District Director as well as schedule a visitation with the parent. Provider District referral packets can be obtained by contacting the Provider District Director and/or Program Specialists of the Provider District where the Program is located.

Upon review of the referral packet and site visit by parent, the Provider District Program Specialist and/or representative will coordinate an IEP team meeting for purposes of discussing possible placement in a Provider District Program. Provider District shall maintain and provide special education programs for Sending District pupils during the 2023/2024 school year. Class size ranges and student-adult ratios shall be maintained in a manner which allows Provider District to matthe programmatic, health and safety needs of the pupils.

### 5. Responsibility of School District of Residence

The Sending District and Provider District acknowledge that the Sending District, as the pupil's district of residence, maintains primary responsibility as the local education agency (LEA) to ensure the pupil receives a free appropriate public education. In the event a pupil participating in a Provider District Program moves out of the Sending District, the Sending District shall immediately provide the Provider District written notice of the pupil's change in residence, including the new school district of residence, if known. Similarly, the Provider District shall immediately notify Sending District in the event a parent reports a change in residence, including the new school district of residence, if known.

### 6. Annual and Triennial Reviews

The Provider District shall be notified of annual reviews scheduled for its pupils participating in a Provider District Program and may provide a representative who will participate in the development of the annual IEP. For initial placement, triennial review, recommendation for

home instruction, or a change in eligibility or services specified on the current IEP, a Sending District representative who is authorized to approve or disapprove the allocation of specified Sending District resources necessary for the implementation of the pupil's IEP shall attend the IEP team meeting. For all other pupils enrolled in a Provider District Program, the Sending District agrees to provide a general education teacher at IEP team meetings unless otherwise waived in writing by pupil's parent in accordance with the IDEA and State law. Subject to approval by the pupil's parents, the general education teacher and/or other IEP team participants may use alternative means of meeting participation, such as video conferences and conference calls.

Progress reports relating to goals and objectives in a pupil's IEP shall be sent by the Provider District to parents per the pupil's IEP schedule for progress reporting and to the Director of Special Education of the Sending District upon request. When requested by Sending District or parent, an updated report shall be provided if there is no current progress report whenever a pupil is scheduled for an IEP review or when pupil's enrollment in Provider District Program is terminated.

### 7. Assessments/Independent Educational Evaluations

In the event a request is made for an Independent Educational Evaluation (IEE), Provider District and/or District Provider school site shall immediately forward such request to the Sending District, in collaboration with the Provider District, shall determine how to respond to the request for an IEE. If the Sending District receives a request for assessment or IEE for a student referred to or enrolled in a Provider District Program, the Sending District shall immediately notify Provider District of the request and collaborate with Provider District as to how to respond. Provider and/or Sending District may also schedule an IEP team meeting to further discuss the requested IEE or assessment.

The Sending District is responsible for all matters related to the IEE including but not limited to the ultimate decision whether or not to grant the IEE, whether or not to file for a Due Process Hearing or other legal proceeding, and all costs related obtaining and conducting the IEE. The Provider District and Provider District school site are not responsible for any costs or legal preceding such as a Due Process hearing and/or Attorney Fees related to the IEE.

### 8. Pupil Count

A count shall be taken of the number of pupils enrolled in GASELPA's Special Schools Program as of the first day of each calendar month, July 2023 through June 2024. A pupil shall be counted as "enrolled" in a Provider District Program on the first day of attendance in the program or fourteen (14) days after the IEP team has met and an approved IEP has been executed for the pupil's educational placement in a Provider District Program, whichever occurs sooner. Pupils continuing in a Provider District Program from the previous school year shall be counted as "enrolled" on the first school day in September unless written notification of withdrawal is received from either the parent or Sending District. If a continuing pupil has not attended school by the eleventh (11th) day of the first school month, Provider District shall notify the Sending District and a determination shall be made regarding continuing enrollment. In the event either Provider District or Sending District are informed that a pupil has been withdrawn by the parent from a Provider District Program, each agency shall immediately notify the other of such withdrawal. Any pupil withdrawn by the parent from a Provider District Program is no longer counted as "enrolled" or considered a continuing pupil for the following school year.

### 9. Definitions

- a. "Provider District Programs" are the special education classes and support services operated by Provider District for severely disabled and medically fragile pupils, pupils with low incidence disabilities, pupils with autism spectrum disorders, pupils with emotional disturbances and other eligible pupils.
- b. "Special Education Program Income" shall be defined as the sum of all State and Federal funds generated by or on behalf of pupils transferred to regional programs operated by Provider District Programs under this Agreement.
- c. "Special Education Program Expenditures" shall include Direct Costs, Direct Support Costs and Indirect Cost of Provider District Programs.

- d. "Average Cost Per Pupil" shall refer to the Special Education Program Expenditures attributable to the program less Special Education Program Income divided by the average number of pupils enrolled during the year.
- e. "Average Number of Pupils" shall refer to the total of the number of pupils counted on the first school day of each calendar month divided by the number of calendar months in the period specified.

### 10. Funding

In consideration of the enrollment of pupils in special education programs conducted by Provider District, the Sending District and/or Sending District SELPA transferring pupils to the regional programs operated by Provider District agree to pay the Provider District the costs of services based on the schedule attached hereto as Exhibit A.

a. Special Circumstance Assistant (SCA). The Sending District, as specified in its SELPA's Local Plan, shall be responsible for the full cost of additional personnel required for the benefit of and specified in the IEP for individual pupils who are residents of the Sending District.

### 11. Home Instruction

When a pupil is absent from school for more than ten (10) consecutive school days as a result of a medical condition and is expected to have an extended health related absence, the pupil's IEP team shall review the IEP and determine appropriate educational services. A Sending District representative who is authorized by the Sending District's Director of Special Education to approve or disapprove the allocation of specified Sending District resources necessary for the implementation of the pupil's IEP shall participate in the IEP team meeting when considering a placement for home or hospital instruction. When recommending placement for home or hospital instruction, the IEP team shall consider documentation from the pupil's treating physician indicating the pupil's condition, verifying that the condition prevents the pupil from attending school and providing a projected date for the pupil's return to school. Any in-home instruction, including other related services, shall be provided by the Sending District or as otherwise agreed to by Provider District and the Sending District. In the event the pupil is hospitalized in a facility located outside of the Sending District, it is the Sending District's responsibility to inform the parent that instruction will be provided in accordance with Education Code section 48207 and 48208. In either circumstance, it may be necessary to exit the pupil from Provider District Program in order for the Sending District to provide the necessary in-home instruction or for the pupil to receive hospital instruction. In the event the Provider District and the Sending District agree that the Provider District will provide in-home or hospital instruction to the pupil, the Provider District shall separately bill the Sending District for such services.

### 12. Transportation

Sending Districts transporting pupils to a Provider District Program shall ensure that buses arrive at the school site with sufficient time to unload students prior to the beginning of the instructional day and to load them at the end of the instructional day. Delays requiring either overtime supervision or causing portions of the instructional program to be missed and

subsequently made up may result in charges to the Sending District for additional costs incurred by the Provider District related to such delays.

### 13. Due Process and Complaints

Provider District and Sending District agree to collaborate and fully cooperate in any due process proceeding involving a pupil currently attending or formerly enrolled in a Provider District Program, including resolution sessions, mediations and hearings, as well as coordinating witness availability and producing documents regarding the pupil.

In the event Provider District is named as the sole LEA in a due process complaint, Provider District and Sending District agree that Sending District, as the pupil's school district of residence, is a necessary party to the due process proceedings.

a. Provider District and Sending District shall also fully participate in the investigation and provision of documentation related to any complaint filed with the State of California, the Office for CivilRights, or any other State and/or federal governmental body or agency.

### 14. Quarterly Billing

The Provider District shall bill the Sending District quarterly invoices based on the estimated costs on Exhibit A.

## 15. Final Accounting

The final invoice will include the appropriate documentation supporting the Provider District expenditures and revenues for the Provider District Program. Final invoice will be sent to the Sending District by October 15<sup>th</sup> of the following fiscal year.

### 16. Projected Enrollment/Facilities and Staffing Needs

In order to assist the Provider District in planning for both facilities and staffing needs for its programs, each Sending District shall submit to, in writing, on or before February 15 of each year, the projected number of pupils expected to be transferred to the Provider District programs for special education and support services in the following school year. Absent a projection, the number of Sending District pupils reported in the current year December 1 Federal Pupil Count shall be used for facilities, staffing and budget planning by the Provider District for the following school year.

### 17. Notices

All notices to be given pursuant to this Agreement, by either party to the other, shall be in writing and (a) delivered in person; (b) deposited in the United States Mail duly certified or registered, return receipt requested with postage prepaid; or (c) sent by Federal Express or other similar overnight delivery service. Notice is deemed to have be duly given and received upon (a) personal delivery; (b) as of the third business day after deposit in the Unities States Mail; or (c) the immediately succeeding business day after deposit with an overnight delivery service. Pupils continuing in the programs from the previous school year shall be counted as "enrolled" on the first school day in September unless written notification of withdrawal is received from either the parent or Sending District. If a continuing pupil has not attended school by the eleventh day of the first school month, the Provider District shall notify the Sending District and a determination shall be made regarding continuing enrollment.

### 7. Definitions

- a. "District Provided Programs" are the special education classes and support services operated by Provider District on behalf of SELPAs and districts in Orange County for special education students residing in their SELPA and district.
- b. "Special Education Program Income" shall be defined as the sum of all State and Federal funds generated by or on behalf of pupils transferred to programs operated by the Provider District under this Agreement.
- c. "Special Education Program Expenditures" shall include Direct Costs multiplied by an allocation factor of 1.5 cost which includes Support Costs and Indirect Cost.

- d. "Average Cost Per Pupil" shall refer to the Special Education Program Expenditures attributable to the program divided by the average number of pupils enrolled during the year.
- e. "Average Number of Pupils" shall refer to the total of the number of pupils counted on the first school day of each calendar month divided by the number of calendar months in the period specified.

### 8. Funding

In consideration of the enrollment of pupils in special education programs conducted by the Provider District, the SELPA and/or the Sending District transferring pupils to the programs operated by the Provider District agree to pay the Provider District the per pupil and shall provide for program funding as follows:

- a. The Sending District shall be responsible for the Average Cost per Pupil in Provider District Program Schools multiplied by the average number of pupils enrolled by the Sending District, minus Special Education Program income received by the Provider District for the purpose of educating said pupils including, but not limited to Revenue Limit and Federal I.D.E.A Local Assistance Grant Funds.
- b. Special Circumstances Paraeducators- The Sending District shall be responsible for the full cost of additional personnel as specified required for the benefit of and in the IEP for pupils who are residents of the Sending District.
  - c. The following documents shall be used as a basis for all figures reported:

Monthly Pupil Count ADA Calculation Program Cost Report Program Summary Report In-House Accounting Reports

d. Income and expenditures shall be listed in accordance with the California School Accounting Manual Standardized Account Code Structure for Special Education as of April 9, 2018.

### 9. Transportation

The Sending District transporting pupils to the Provider District shall ensure that buses arrive at the school site with sufficient time to unload students prior to the beginning of the instructional day and to load them at the end of the instructional day. Delays requiring either overtime supervision or causing portions of the instructional program to be missed and subsequently made up may result in charges to the Sending District for additional costs incurred by the Provider District.

### 10. Final Accounting

A final accounting accompanied by completed forms and invoices with appropriate supporting documentation will be sent by the Provider District to Sending District by October 15 of the following year. Corrections to prior year Special Education Program costs resulting from adjustments to income or expenditure calculations shall be credited or billed to the Sending District affected by the correction or adjustments.

### 11. Projected Enrollment

In order to assist the Provider District in planning for both housing and staffing needs for the programs, Sending District shall submit to the Provider District, in writing, on or before February 15 of each year, the projected number of pupils expected to be transferred to the programs for special education and support services in the following school year. Absent a projection, the number of Sending District pupils reported in the current year December 1 Federal Pupil Count shall be used for staffing and budget planning for the following school year.

### 12. <u>Program Cost</u>

On or before fifteen days after the release of the May revise each year, the Provider District shall compute the projected Special Education Program Income and Special Education Program Expenditures for the following year with an Average Cost per Pupil for pupils enrolled in SAUSD Program for Deaf and Hard of Hearing Students based on the Projected Enrollment data, and provide it to Sending District's Special Education Department and Business Services Department.

### 13. No Waiver

The failure of the Provider District in any one or more instances to insist upon strict performance of any of the terms of this Agreement or to exercise any option herein conferred shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment to any extent of the right to assert or rely upon such terms or option on any future occasion.

### 14. Hold Harmless

To the extent permitted by law, and except for the acts or omissions or employees, agents and officers of the Sending District, the Provider District hereby agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend the Sending District and its officers, agents and employees from all claims, demands, liabilities, losses, damages, or expenses of any nature whatsoever arising from or connected with the Provider District's performance of services during the term of this Agreement.

To the extent permitted by law, and except for the acts or omissions of employees, agents and officers of Provider District, the Sending District hereby agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend Provider District and its governing board and their officers, agents and employees from all claims, demands, liabilities, losses, damages, or expenses of any nature whatsoever arising directly or indirectly from or connected with the performance of services other than for operations of Provider District during the term of this Agreement.

### 15. Complete Agreement

This Agreement is the complete Agreement of the parties. Any amendments hereto shall be in writing and shall be dated and executed by both parties.

WHEREAS, SUPERINTENDENT is desirous of contracting with DISTRICT for the provision of K-12 Student Advocates for Mental Health Program Advisor Incentives in order to comply with the Agreement with COUNTY to provide comprehensive primary prevention programs to the residents of Orange County; and

WHEREAS, SUPERINTENDENT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for

the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is specially trained, experienced and competent to perform the services required, and is agreeable to the rendering of such services according to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1.0 SCOPE OF WORK. SUPERINTENDENT hereby engages DISTRICT as an independent contractor to provide the services as described in the "STUDENT ADVOCATES FOR MENTAL HEALTH 2023-2024 Peer-led Campaign (PLC) Advisor Incentive Requirements", which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by this reference. SUPERINTENDENT shall provide advisor incentives to the designated Student Advocates for Mental Health advisor(s) at: El Dorado High School. DISTRICT hereby agrees to perform said work upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth for the Educational Services Division.
- 2.0 <u>TERM</u>. DISTRICT shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on December 1, 2023 and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by June 30, 2024, subject to termination as set forth in this AGREEMENT.

DISTRICT, in the performance of AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the SUPERINTENDENT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the SUPERINTENDENT and/or to which SUPERINTENDENT'S employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. DISTRICT assumes responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. DISTRICT shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to DISTRICT'S employees.

sustained by the DISTRICT or any person, firm or corporation employed by the DISTRICT, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the SUPERINTENDENT, the Orange County Board of Education, or its officers, employees or agents.

- (b) Any injury to or death of any persons, including the SUPERINTENDENT or its officers, agents and employees, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the DISTRICT, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the DISTRICT, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off SUPERINTENDENT'S property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the SUPERINTENDENT, the Orange County Board of Education, or its officers, employees or agents.
- (c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT.
- 7.0 <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>. The obligations of the DISTRICT pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the DISTRICT without prior written approval of SUPERINTENDENT.

# ORANGE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ("MOU")

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into by and between the Orange County Superintendent of Schools, herein called the "Program Sponsor" and **Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District** herein called the "District," who agrees to participate in the Orange County Superintendent of Schools Career Technical Education (CTE) Teacher Credentialing Program.

### 1. PROGRAM SPONSOR: BASIC RESPONSIBILITIES

The Program Sponsor agrees to:

- A. Provide credential services for Designated Subjects CTE Credential candidates
  - Review and advise on eligibility requirements.
  - Analyze application packet to confirm eligibility.
  - Recommend to the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) the approved candidate's application for a Preliminary Designated Subjects CTE Credential.
- B. Establish and maintain a partnership with the District
  - Distribute periodic commission and program information.
  - Convene the Institute for Leadership Development (ILD) advisory council a minimum of twice a year to further support collaboration among local Institutions of Higher Education (IHE's), District and all relevant stakeholders.
- C. Provide all program coursework and support
  - Provide CTC approved coursework facilitated by CTE experts delivered in an online environment.
  - Review and analyze data from course evaluations to inform program decisions.
  - Establish partnerships with IHE's and District to identify additional professional development opportunities and support.
  - Provide professional development opportunities for district hired mentors.
- D. Adhere to the Commission on Teacher Credentialing mandates as they apply to educator preparation programs as defined by the 7-year accreditation reporting cycle.

### 2. <u>DISTRICT: BASIC RESPONSIBILITIES</u>

The District agrees to:

- A. Identify one (1) District contact person.
  - This individual will serve as the District representative to work collaboratively with the ILD Program Coordinator to support their candidate(s) enrollment in the Program Sponsor's CTE Teacher Credentialing Program.
  - This individual will participate in a program orientation to secure a current understanding of program requirements timelines and available resources.
  - This individual will sit on the ILD advisory council representing their Districts interest.
- B. Ensure candidates enroll in the next available CTE cohort following recommendation of preliminary credential.
- C. Provide a mentor to all enrolled CTE program candidates. These mentors will work with the Program Sponsor to give ongoing support to candidates. CTE mentor must meet minimum qualifications as outlined in Exhibit "A", "CTE Mentor Selection Guidelines, Roles and Responsibilities", which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein.

#### 3. TERM AND TERMINATION

This agreement shall be effective from July 1, 2023 until June 30, 2024 and is renewable annually, by mutual written agreement. The MOU may be amended by mutual written consent of the parties and may be terminated by Program Sponsor upon thirty (30) days advance written notification.

#### 4. PAYMENT

A. District Not Paying Tuition:

If the District is not paying program costs for candidates going through the Program Sponsor's CTE Teacher Credentialing Program, the program tuition and all other costs will be the responsibility of the enrolled candidate.

B. District Paying Tuition:

If the District agrees to pay program tuition for candidates going through the Program Sponsor's CTE Teacher Credentialing Program, fees are outlined in Exhibit "B", which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein. Tuition will be invoiced on a quarterly basis at the time class registration closes.

 Program application fee will be collected from the candidate and is due at the time the candidate applies to the program.

#### 5. INDEMNIFICATION

Both parties agree to defend, indemnify, save, and hold harmless each other from and against any and all demands, debts, liens, claims, losses, damages, liability, costs, expenses (including, but not by way of limitation, attorneys fees and costs actually incurred, whether or not litigation has commenced), judgments or obligations, actions, or causes of action whatsoever, for or in connection with injury, damage, or loss (including, but not limited to death) to any person or property unless such injury, damage or loss results from or is connected with the sole negligence or error or omission of the other party. The provisions of this clause shall not be limited to the availability or collectability of insurance coverage.

#### 6. INSURANCE

Both parties shall maintain such general liability, property damage, workers' compensation, and auto insurance, and any other insurance as may be necessary, as is required to protect Program Sponsor's and District interests as they may appear.

### 7. EMPLOYEE FINGERPRINTING

During the entire term of the MOU, both parties, including any/all subcontractors, shall fully comply with the provisions of the Education Code Section 45125.1 when either parties' employees and/or employees of subcontractors will have more than limited contact with Program Sponsor's candidates.

#### 8. GOVERNING LAW/FORUM SELECTION

This MOU is made, entered into and executed in Orange County, California, and the parties agree that any legal action, claim or proceeding arising out of or connected with this Contract shall be filed in the applicable court in Orange County, California. The parties further agree this Contract shall be construed, and all disputes hereunder shall be settled, in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

#### 9. INCORPORATION BY REFERENCE

Any exhibits referenced herein shall be incorporated and made a part of this MOU.

#### 10. PROVISIONS REQUIRED BY LAW DEEMED INSERTED

Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in this MOU shall be deemed to be inserted herein and the MOU shall be read and enforced as though it were so inserted and included.

### 11. NO THIRD-PARTY OBLIGATIONS

The execution and delivery of this MOU shall not be deemed to confer any rights upon, nor obligate any parties thereto, to any person or entity other than the parties hereto.

### 12. TOBACCO-FREE POLICY

In the interest of public health, Program Sponsor provides a tobacco-free environment. Smoking or the use of any tobacco products are prohibited in buildings and vehicles, and on any property owned, leased or contracted for by the Program Sponsor pursuant to Program Sponsor's Board Policy 400-7. Failure to abide with conditions of this policy could result in the termination of this MOU.

### 13. ALCOHOL AND DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE

Both parties hereby certify under penalty or perjury under the laws of the State of California that they will comply with the requirements of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988 (Government Code Section 8350 et. seq.), and the Orange County Board of Education's Alcohol and Drug-Free Workplace Policy 7240.

#### 14. RECORD RETENTION AND INSPECTION

Both parties shall have access to and the right to examine, audit, excerpt, copy or transcribe any pertinent records pertaining to this MOU. All records shall be kept and maintained by District/Program Sponsor and made available to Program Sponsor/District during the entire term of this Contract and for a period not less than five (5) years.

#### 15. NOTICES

All notices or demands to be given under this MOU by either Party to the other shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third (3rd) day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either Party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section.   - \$300.00 Application fee to OCDE non-refundable
- ✓ Complete the free, self-paced, on-line Early Orientation course within 30 days of receiving the email instructions. Note: It is strongly recommended that any CTE candidate lacking appropriate computer hardware and software or basic computer skills (including the ability to utilize the Internet and email as well as download, print, and create PDF documents) should purchase the necessary equipment and complete a computer literacy course prior to applying for the CTE credential.
- ✓ Complete the required program coursework. All courses are offered online.
  - o Cohort Cost of \$3,000.00 which includes
    - > CTE 101 Teacher Preparation Course
    - CTE 102 Instructional Practices of CTE Course
    - EL 100 English Language Learner Course
- ✓ Complete CPR (Infant, Child and Adult), Health for Educators, and U.S. Constitution requirements.
- ✓ Verify four terms/two years of successful teaching, from the date the preliminary credential is issued, in the industry sector listed on the credential. The experience must be a minimum of one course in each of the four terms, two of which must be with the same employing school district.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 23-16 - CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION MONTH**

#### **Background**

Career and Technical Education Month, or CTE Month, is a public awareness campaign that takes place each February to celebrate the value of CTE and the achievements and accomplishments of CTE programs across the country.

 INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS: During the term of this Agreement, consultant/contractor shall maintain insurance documentation per the limits and requirements outlined:

Any insurance maintained by contractor/consultant/ service provider shall be primary and any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the District shall be excess and non-contributing.

Automobile Insurance: The contractor/consultant/service provider shall maintain a minimum of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate. COI must show "All Autos".

The parties to the Agreement shall be excused from performance thereunder during the time and to the extent that they are prevented from obtaining, delivering or performing by act of God, fire, strike, loss, or shortage of transportation facilities, lock-out, commandeering of materials, products, plants or facilities by the government, when satisfactory evidence thereof is presented to the District, provided that it is satisfactorily established that the nonperformance is not due to the fault or neglect of the party not performing.
- 15. It is the policy of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District Board of Education that in connection with all work or services performed under this Agreement there will be no discrimination against any employee engaged in the work because of race, color, ancestry, sex, national origin, handicapping condition, or religious creed, and therefore the consultant/contractor agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to, Government Code Section 12940, et seq.

# GRAND CANYON UNIVERSITY, FIELD PLACEMENT AFFILIATION AGREEMENT, JANUARY 17, 2024-JANUARY 18, 2027

#### **Background**

The Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District and Grand Canyon University wish to continue their partnership in placing student teachers in our classrooms. In order to begin our partnership, it is necessary to approve our student teaching agreement.

Providing future teachers an opportunity to participate in the student teaching experience helps to assure that they are adequately trained and possess the necessary skills to be competent teachers. All student teachers are carefully screened by the University to ensure they are fully qualified prior to beginning their assignment in the classroom.

Participation by our District with Grand Canyon University in the placement of student teachers assists the District in its future recruitments.

#### **Financial Impact**

The University shall pay \$500 to the cooperating teacher per each 15/16-week session of full-time service. Longer or shorter sessions will be paid on a pro-rated basis.

# Field Placement Affiliation Agreement Between GCU and Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District

- 1. PARTIES: This Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into on this 01/17/2024 day by and between Grand Canyon University ("GCU") and Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District located at 1301 E. Orangethorpe Ave. Placentia, CA 92870 hereafter referred to as the (the "District").
- 2. <u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of this non-exclusive Agreement is to establish the terms and conditions under which candidates of GCU may participate in Practicum/Field Experience, Student Teaching, and/or Educational Administration Internships at the schools located in the District.
- 3. TERM: The term of this Agreement begins 01/17/2024 and ends 01/17/2027.
- 4. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DISTRICT:
  - **4a.** The District shall provide participating candidates with field placement experiences in a school of the District under direct supervision of a host teacher ("Cooperating Teacher") or host mentor ("Mentor") that meets the minimum GCU qualification requirements as outlined in the applicable program manual (See Appendix).
  - **4b.** The District shall ensure that the Cooperating Teacher/Mentor provides oversight, feedback and mentoring to GCU's participating candidates. Cooperating Teacher/Mentor expectations are outlined in the applicable program manual. (See Appendix.)
  - **4c.** The District shall provide the participating candidate prior to the start of the field placement with any District policies and procedures to which the candidate is expected to adhere to during the candidate's field placement while on District premises.
  - **4d.** The District shall allow a GCU faculty supervisor (the "GCU Faculty Supervisor") virtual and/or in-person access to the host school and classroom for the specific purpose of observing the participating candidate.
  - **4e.** The District shall through the involvement of the Cooperating Teacher/Mentor, communicate with the GCU Faculty Supervisor and candidate to provide feedback on the candidate's performance which will be used by the GCU Faculty Supervisor for completion of the candidate's formal evaluation.
  - 4f. The District shall have the right to refuse a candidate for field placement or may terminate the field placement of any candidate based upon its good faith determination that the candidate is not meeting performance standards or is otherwise deemed unacceptable to the District. Notices of such decisions shall be provided to GCU in writing and shall state reasons for such decisions.
  - **4g.** The District shall provide participating candidates with immediate first aid for work-related injuries or illnesses, such as blood or body fluid exposure.
  - **4h.** The District shall promptly and thoroughly investigate any complaint by any participating candidate or GCU regarding unlawful discrimination or harassment at the field placement site or involving employees or agents of the field placement site and take prompt and effective remedial action when discrimination or harassment is found to have occurred and to promptly notify GCU of the existence and outcome of any complaint of harassment by, against or involving any participating candidate.
  - **4i**. The District shall support the candidate in compliance with all policies of GCU that pertain to this Agreement as outlined in the University Policy Handbook and applicable program manuals. Please refer to the program manuals regarding recording, virtual services, and informed consent requirements(see Appendices).

**4j.** The District shall comply with all federal, state, and local statutes and regulations applicable to the performance of the Agreement.

#### 5. RESPONSIBILITIES OF GCU:

**5a.** GCU shall pay a \$500 stipend to Cooperating Teachers per each 15/16-week session of full-time service. Longer or shorter sessions will be paid on a pro-rated basis.

**5b**. GCU shall pay the stipend upon the completion of the student teaching semester provided all paperwork has been submitted.

**5c.** GCU shall not provide compensation to Mentors hosting candidates for Practicum/Field Experiences, Educational Administration Internships, or Student Teaching in the instance where the candidate is employed as a full-time teacher of record.

5d. GCU shall provide a GCU Faculty Supervisor for candidates completing the student teaching or educational administration internships to evaluate a candidate's performance through virtual and/or in-person observations. The GCU Faculty Supervisor will meet requirements and expectations as outlined in the applicable program's handbook.

**5e.** GCU shall require that all candidates who must enter a field placement site provide GCU with a current and clear copy of a background check. GCU will prohibit candidates from moving forward in the field placement process until this document is received.

5fGCU shall promptly and thoroughly investigate any complaint by any participating candidate or the District regarding unlawful discrimination or harassment at the field placement site or involving employees or agents of the field placement site and take prompt and effective remedial action when discrimination or harassment is found to have occurred and to promptly notify the District of the existence and outcome of any complaint of harassment by, against or involving any participating candidate.

**5g.** GCU shall comply with all policies of GCU and the District that pertain to this Agreement. **5h.** GCU shall comply with all federal, state, and local statutes and regulations applicable to the performance of the Agreement.

- 6. CANDIDATE COMPLIANCE WITH GCU AND DISTRICT POLICIES: Candidates accepted to the District for field placement shall be subject to all applicable policies and regulations of the District and GCU. Prior to assignment of candidates to the District, GCU will advise candidates of any specific requirements that must be met to participate in the applicable field placement. These specific requirements are outlined in the applicable program manual. (See Appendix.) Failure to complete the requirements will result in non-placement of candidates.
- 7. PAID POSITIONS/EMPLOYMENT: GCU does not solicit, source, or guarantee paid opportunities or employment for Candidates. GCU may allow a Candidate to maintain a paid position during Student Teaching if deemed appropriate by the District and the role is in alignment to the Candidate's university program of study, setting and coursework requirements and desired certification. The Candidate must have an appropriately certified mentor available at the school site. Candidates requesting to hold a paid position must complete additional documentation that requires written approval from the District. Requests to student teach in a paid position are reviewed by the College of Education on a case-by-case basis and are not guaranteed.
- 8. <u>INSURANCE AND LIABILITY:</u> GCU will maintain in full force and effect, at its sole expense and written by carriers acceptable to District:

- 9. FERPA: GCU and the District agree to protect the candidate's and/or student's educational records in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C. 1232g ("FERPA") and any applicable policy of GCU and the District. To the extent permitted by law, GCU and the District may share information from a candidate's and/or student's educational records with each other so that each can perform its respective responsibilities under this Agreement but shall not disclose or share educational records with any third party without the candidate's and/or student's prior written consent.
- 10. CONFIDENTIALITY: GCU shall inform each participating candidate of Federal law governing the confidentiality of District student information, including FERPA. The District shall inform each participating candidate of any applicable State law governing the confidentiality of student information. The District shall also inform each participating Cooperating Teacher/Mentor that they are bound to maintain in confidence, any documents or other confidential information about the participating candidate and GCU to which they might have access. Any breach of confidentiality by a participating candidate, Cooperating Teacher or Mentor shall be grounds for immediate termination of the field placement.
- 11. <u>INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS:</u> Neither party shall be responsible for personal injury or property damage or other loss except that resulting from its own negligence or the negligence of its employees or others for whom the party is legally responsible.
- 12. <u>USE OF MARKS AND LOGOS; RIGHT OF PUBLICITY:</u> The District hereby grants GCU the right and license to publish and/or use District's logos or trademarks for all purposes connected with the promotion of the Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing license, District shall retain all right,

title, and interest in and to District's logos and trademarks. District shall allow GCU to publicize District, the Agreement and the related programs in all advertising, publicity, and promotion, including GCU websites, and social media. GCU's right to utilize District's logos and trademarks and right of publicity will survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement for a reasonable period of time until GCU is able to revise and update such materials, websites, and social media.

- 13. <u>ASSIGNMENT:</u> The provisions of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the successors of the parties hereto. Neither this Agreement nor any of the rights or obligations here under may be transferred or assigned without prior written consent of the other party.
- 14. <u>NOTICES:</u> Notices under this Agreement shall be in writing and mailed electronically, or delivered to the parties as follows:

- 15. <u>MODIFICATION OF AGREEMENT:</u> This Agreement may be modified only by written amendment executed by both parties.
- 16. <u>TERMINATION:</u> Either party, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party, may terminate this Agreement.
- 17. PARTNERSHIP/JOINT VENTURE/EMPLOYEMENT: Nothing herein shall in any way be construed or intended to create a partnership or joint venture between the parties or to create the relationship of principal and agent between or among any of the parties. Candidates are not employees, independent contractors, or agents of GCU. The relationship between Candidates and the District shall be determined by the District according to its policies and agreements with the Candidates.
- 18. <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:</u> The relationship between Cooperating Teachers and GCU shall be that of an independent contractor and shall not be deemed to be that of an employer-employee relationship, joint venture, or partnership. Cooperating Teachers shall be solely responsible for the payment of their own state and federal income tax and self-employment tax as applicable.
- 19. NONDISCRIMINATION: The parties shall comply with Title VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Americans with Disability Act of 1990 and the regulations related thereto. The parties will not discriminate against any individual including but not limited to employees or applicants for employment and/or candidates because of race, religion, creed, color, sex, age, disability, veteran status, or national origin. This section shall not apply to discrimination in employment on the basis of religion that is specifically exempt under the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. §2000 e).

  GOVERNING LAW: This Agreement shall be governed in all respects, whether as to validity, construction, capacity, performance, or otherwise, by the laws of the State of California, without giving effect to its conflict of laws rules. Any dispute, controversy, or claim arising out of or in

connection with this Agreement shall be settled by confidential arbitration under the Rules for Commercial Arbitration of the American Arbitration Association, by one arbitrator reasonably familiar with the business pertaining to the services covered by the Agreement, appointed in accordance with such Rules. The arbitrator shall apply the laws of the State of California to the merits of any dispute or claim. Judgment on the award entered by the arbitrator may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof.

# APPROVE THE EARLY RETIREMENT/RESIGNATION NOTICE INCENTIVE FOR CERTIFICATED EMPLOYEES
