Superintendent Smith announced that eleven Placentia-Yorba Linda Schools were invited to apply for next year's California Distinguished School recognition, including Fairmont, Glenknoll, Glenview, Golden, Linda Vista, Mabel Paine, Rose Drive, Sierra Vista, Van Buren, Wagner, and Woodsboro. Dr. Smith also shared the results of the API scores which indicated that every single elementary, middle and high school in our district surpassed the state's API growth target, as did every sub-group.
