EMERGENCY RESOLUTION FOR
REPAIR AND REMEDIATION OF FACILITIES AND IMPROVEMENT OF DRAINAGE AT MABEL
PAINE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**

RESOLUTION NO. 26

WHEREAS, the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District has, prior to October, 2004, operated the Mabel Paine Elementary School without serious flooding incidents for over 40 years;

WHEREAS, recent heavy rains and increased flows from upland properties occurring on or about October 20, 2004 resulted in the inundation of large portions of the campus and its buildings;

WHEREAS, the resulting flow of water, mud and debris potentially endangered students and staff and resulted in loss of instructional time, the temporary closing of the school and significant damage to District property and facilities as demonstrated by the attached photographs of damage to the campus, Exhibits 1-8;

WHEREAS, a campus properly protected from flooding is essential to the health, safety and welfare of students, staff and persons on the campus;

WHEREAS, large quantities of silt and debris must be removed from the campus and from its buildings;

WHEREAS, extra expense has been and will be incurred to repair and mitigate the damage that has been done by flood waters to District buildings and facilities on campus;

WHEREAS, immediate action must be taken to prevent a recurrence of flooding at Mabel Paine Elementary School;

WHEREAS, a properly functioning flood control system at Mabel Paine Elementary School is necessary to prevent further flooding and mitigate an unsafe condition;

WHEREAS, an emergency situation exists due to the need to complete work and alleviate a potentially dangerous threat to student and staff health and safety and to protect District buildings and facilities from flooding at the Mabel Paine Elementary School campus;

WHEREAS, competitive bidding for the completion of work on the clean up and repair of facilities, the immediate improvement of flood control facilities, and the repair of any subsequent damage which may occur from future flooding incidents at Mabel Paine Elementary School before flood control can be improved would cause unnecessary delay in completion of the repair, remediation and storm protection work and would exacerbate a potentially dangerous condition exposing the District to unnecessary danger to life or property;

WHEREAS, Public Contract Code Section 20113 provides that in an emergency, when any repairs, alterations, work or improvement is necessary to any facility of public schools to permit the continuance of existing school classes or to avoid danger to life or property, the governing board of a school district may, by unanimous vote and approval of the County Superintendent of Schools, make a contract in writing for the performance of labor and furnishing of materials or supplies without advertising for or inviting bids;

WHEREAS, Meakin v. Steveland (1977) 68 Cal.App.3d 490 and Los Angeles Dredging Company v. Long Beach (1930) 210 Cal. 348 hold that statutes requiring competitive bidding do not apply when competitive bidding would work an incongruity or not produce any advantage;

WHEREAS, completion of repair and remediation of damage caused by the recent storm and the improvement of storm control facilities is an integral part of ensuring a safe and adequate educational environment and, therefore, it would work an incongruity and not produce any advantage to the District to competitively bid the work; and
