RESOLUTION NO. 25**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE
PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DENYING THE PETITION FOR
GLOBAL TIDES @ ORANGE COUNTY CHARTER SCHOOL**

WHEREAS, a petition for the grant of a charter school is governed by the standards and criteria set forth in Education Code section 47605; and

WHEREAS, Marco Salazar on behalf of Charter School Development Systems submitted a charter petition and supporting documentation, incorporated herein by reference, to Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District ("District") on or about September 9, 2009, seeking the grant of a Charter for establishment of Global Tides @ Orange County Charter School, which proposes to offer a K-12, on-line, independent study program; and

WHEREAS, Charter School Development Systems submitted substantially identical charter school petitions, signed by the same six teachers, to 91 public school districts in 14 strategically located counties throughout California and has stated an intent to open charter schools simultaneously in all 14 such counties; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on or about October 13, 2009, to determine the level of support for the petition by teachers, other employees of the District and parents/guardians in accordance with Education Code section 47605(b); and

WHEREAS, in reviewing the petition for the Charter, the Board of Education of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District ("Board") is cognizant of the intent of the Legislature that charter schools are and should become an integral part of the California educational system and that establishment of charter schools should be encouraged; and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent and/or his designees have reviewed and analyzed the petition, proposed Charter, and supporting documentation submitted by petitioner.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the Board of Education of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District, having fully considered and evaluated the record in connection with the petition for grant of a Global Tides @ Orange County Charter School, hereby finds the petition not to be consistent with sound educational practice, based upon grounds and factual findings including, but not limited to, the following:

- A. *The petition does not contain the number of signatures required by law. [Ed. Code § 47605(b)(3).]***
- B. *The petition does not contain reasonably comprehensive descriptions of all of the elements prescribed by law. [Ed. Code § 47605(b)(5).]***
- C. *The petitioner is demonstrably unlikely to successfully implement the program set forth in the petition. [Ed. Code § 47605(b)(2).]***

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the Board of Education of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District hereby determines the foregoing findings are supported by the following specific facts:

A. *The petition does not contain the number of signatures required by law. [Ed. Code § 47605(b)(3).]*

1. The petition submitted in support of the charter lacks the requisite number of valid signatures because the same six (6) teacher signatures purporting to be “meaningfully interested in teaching at the Global Tides Online Charter School” were submitted to 91 public school districts located in 14 counties throughout California. The Charter states that “[a]ll teachers will be hired from the same geographical region as the students,” but it is not possible for the six teachers who signed the petition to be from the “same geographical region as the students” to be served by all 91 petitions.

2. The petition circulated in support of the charter contains defects in the form of the petition which render it legally insufficient in that the petitions do not identify the District by name or otherwise indicate that petitioners executed a petition for the grant of a charter to “Global Tides @ Orange County” by the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District.

3. The signature pages do not indicate that the petition was attached to the signature pages and/or that the petition was readily available for review by the teachers who signed the signature pages.

B. *The petition does not contain reasonably comprehensive descriptions of all of the elements prescribed by law. [Ed. Code § 47605(b)(5).]*

1. The proposed Charter does not contain a reasonably comprehensive description of the charter school’s governance structure.

a. The Charter contemplates that the charter school will be operated and managed by corporations that are not legally constituted as of the date of the petition. The petition lacks evidence of the proposed corporations’ Articles of Incorporation or By-laws. The Charter does not comprehensively describe the operating relationship of the proposed corporations or ensure public access and accountability by requiring each of the corporations to comply with the Brown Act, Public Records Act, Political Reform Act, and/or conflict of interest laws applicable to public agencies. The Charter does not adequately describe processes to ensure the active and effective involvement of parents in the governance of the school.

b. The relationship and interactions between Global Tides @ Orange County, Charter School Development Systems, EdFutures, eTap, and other entities involved in the operation of the proposed school are not adequately described or explained in the Charter. However, the information provided indicates that the financial and operational entanglements between the various entities and their respective officers and employees violate prohibitions against conflicts of interests and otherwise constitute unsound public fiscal management. It appears that the proposed non-profit Global Tides corporation would provide no services or controls over the school and that the for-profit EdFutures and Charter School Development Systems shall actually operate the school and control its finances.

C. *The petitioner is demonstrably unlikely to successfully implement the program set forth in the petition. [Ed. Code § 47605(b)(2).]*

1. The specific findings of fact set forth in paragraphs A.1 through B.1, above, are restated and incorporated herein by reference. Said specific facts evidence that petitioner is demonstrably unlikely to successfully implement the program set forth in the petition.

2. The public hearing on October 13, 2009, was wholly lacking in any expression of support for the proposed charter school by teachers, other employees, and/or parents of the District. No representative of Charter School Development Systems or other entities involved in the operation of the proposed charter school appeared at the public hearing.

3. The Petition proposes to commence instruction in January 2010, in violation of Education Code Section 47652(c), which provides that new charter schools must begin operations within the first three months of the fiscal year beginning July 1. This defect demonstrates an unfamiliarity and lack of knowledge of the laws applicable to California charter schools on the part of Petitioners.

4. The financial planning and budget information provided are not accurate. The budget information lacks specific details, overstates projected income and understates projected expenses. The submitted budget is not consistent with provisions of the Charter. The Charter states that the school will enroll approximately 100 students in the first year of operation, and add 100 additional students per year for the first three years of operation, with an average class size of 20-25 students for each of those three years. However, the budgeted income is based on an assumption of a 100% attendance rate for projected enrollments of 164 students in 2010-2011, 245 students for 2011-2012, and 328 students for 2012-2013. In addition, the budget specifies a pupil:teacher ratio of 82:1 for the first three years of operation and increases to 90:1 in years four and five. This staffing ratio violates the requirements of Education Code section 51745.6 and Title 5, California Code of Regulations, section 11704, which require a charter school operating an independent study program not to exceed a pupil:teacher ratio of 25:1 or the ratio of pupils to full-time equivalent certificated employees for all other educational programs operated by the largest unified school district in the county or counties in which the charter school operates.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the terms of this Resolution are severable. Should it be determined that one or more of the findings and/or the factual determinations supporting the findings is invalid, the remaining findings and/or factual determinations and the denial of the Charter shall remain in full force and effect. In this regard, the Board of Education of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District specifically finds that each factual determination, in and of itself, is a sufficient basis for the finding it supports, and each such finding, in and of itself, is a sufficient basis for denial.
