


- These funds are available through the 2025-26 school year
- LEAs may allocate these funds for 5 purposes

Five Purposes


- Obtaining standards-aligned professional development and instructional materials for:

 - World Languages
 - Mathematics
 - Science, including environmental literacy
 - English Language Arts, including early literacy
 - Ethnic Studies
 - Financial Literacy
 - Media Literacy
 - Computer Science
 - History-Social Science





Five Purposes (continued)


- 2. Obtaining professional development and instructional materials for **improving school climate**
- 3. Developing diverse, culturally relevant and multilingual school library book collections
- 4. Operational costs for a variety of programs, including retirement and health care cost increases
- 5. **COVID-19-related costs** necessary to keep pupils and staff safe for in-person instruction



This funding works in conjunction with . . . Proposition 28

Prop 28: Schools must spend 80% of the money on arts and music teachers and aides, with the remainder of the funds earmarked for art supplies and materials.

Estimated Allocation: \$3,554,103
