5. PUBLIC COMMENT ANNOUNCEMENT

The Board's bylaws do not allow forms to be submitted once the presiding officer has called for Public Comment.

Public comment speakers are expected to abide by Board Policy 1312, *Civility Policy*, which promotes mutual respect, civility, and orderly conduct among district employees, parents, and the public. This policy is not intended to deprive any person of his/her right to freedom of expression, but only to maintain, to the extent possible and reasonable, a safe, harassment-free environment. Individuals are reminded that they are expected to abide by the Civility Policy at all times while on district properties, including, but not limited to, hallways, restrooms, lobbies, and parking lots. Any individual who, during a school board meeting, disrupts with violence or threatens to disrupt with violence school/office operations or threatens the safety of any individual attending or participating in the Board meeting will be reported to the police immediately.

Additionally, if there are any disruptions or interference of the Board's ability to conduct its meeting, the disruptive parties will be given one warning. If the disruption continues, you will be informed that the Board President has found

you disruptive in violation of Penal Code Section 403, Education Code Section 32210, and the Board President will order you removed from the meeting under Government Code 54957.9, 54957.95. If removing one or several disruptive parties does not restore order, the Board President will exercise their authority to clear the room in accordance with Government Code 54957.9.

Education Code 220 prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability, gender, gender identity, gender expression, nationality, race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, or any other characteristic that is contained in the definition of hate crimes set forth in Section 422.55 of the Penal Code, including immigration status.

Public speakers shall be allocated a maximum of three (3) minutes to address the board regarding any item or items. The number of minutes allowed for each speaker shall be determined by the number of speakers who submit their names prior to the beginning of public comment. When translation is requested, up to three additional minutes will be provided for English translation.

- 1-10 speakers: 3 minutes each
- 11-15 speakers: 2 minutes each
- 16-30 speakers: 1.5 minutes each
- 31+ speakers: 1 minute each

**PROPOSITION 28: ARTS AND MUSIC IN SCHOOLS FUNDING ANNUAL REPORT FISCAL
YEAR 2024-2025**

Background

As a requirement of Proposition 28, each local educational agency (LEA) must annually submit reporting and audit requirements for the Arts and Music in Schools (AMS) Fund. These annual audits of kindergarten through grade twelve are conducted in accordance with California Education Code (EC) Section 41020 and shall include funds received and distributed by the LEA pursuant to Proposition 28.

These audits verify that the funds were used according to statutory requirements. To receive AMS funds, LEAs must annually certify that the funds will be used exclusively for arts education programs and confirm that the previous year's expenditures met this requirement. For LEAs with enrollments of 500 or more pupils, at least 80% of the funds must be allocated to employing staff for arts education, with the remainder used for training, supplies, materials, and partnership programs, unless a waiver is granted. Additionally, LEAs must certify that the funds supplement existing arts education budgets and limit administrative expenses to no more than 1%. An annual report, approved by the governing board, must be submitted and posted on both the LEA's and the California Department of Education's websites. This report should detail the types of arts programs funded, staffing levels, pupil participation, and the number of school sites offering arts education.

1. Narrative description of the Prop 28 arts education program(s) funded. (2500 character limit).

The Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District (PYLUSD) continued to effectively use Proposition 28 (Prop 28) funding in 2024–25 to strengthen Visual & Performing Arts (VAPA) education for 18,434 students across 34 schools—10,468 elementary (K–6) and 7,966 secondary. Funding sustained K–3 general music instruction with two full-time teachers, ensuring every student received weekly lessons. Grades 4–6 benefited from an additional vocal music class, providing parity with instrumental music through an extra day of choir. Visual arts also continued with three itinerant instructors delivering standards-based lessons at every elementary school, ensuring equitable access for all students. Staffing supported by Prop 28 remained a cornerstone of success. Elementary instructional aides, along with coaches in instrumental music, choir, dance, and other performing arts, provided essential assistance with classroom management, event preparation, and small-group instruction. These roles improved instructional quality, reduced logistical barriers, and increased student engagement. At the secondary level, Prop 28 investments enhanced both visual and performing arts. Visual art programs purchased consumable supplies and digital cameras, expanding into modern media. Visual arts also added staff for art and ceramics labs with instructional assistants. Theater benefited from program coordination and stagecraft expansion. Technology-driven opportunities were also strengthened through video production resources, robotics equipment, and a new LEGO club with teacher stipend and materials. Prop 28 also supported authentic learning experiences outside the classroom, including arts-focused field trips and summer program staffing, extending opportunities for students beyond the school year. Overall, the 2024–25 school year highlighted PYLUSD's ongoing commitment to equitable, high-quality arts education. Prop 28 funding has expanded access, supported program growth, modernized resources, and inspired students to discover and develop their artistic talents.
