**RESOLUTION NO. 22  
OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE  
PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT**

On motion of Member of Eric Padget duly seconded and carried, the following Resolution was adopted.

**WHEREAS**, the District no longer has the financial ability or resources to provide all services which it is currently providing given the current economic difficulties faced by the State of California and by school districts throughout the State;

**WHEREAS**, in order to maintain a balanced budget and provide for essential services in the most acceptable manner, the District must eliminate programs and services in the 2009-2010 fiscal year;

**WHEREAS**, it will be necessary to reduce or discontinue the particular kinds of services now being rendered by certificated personnel for the 2009-2010 fiscal year as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference;

**WHEREAS**, the reduction or elimination of said services may result in reassignment and/or laying off of certificated employees; and

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary for the Superintendent to give notice to employees who may be laid off as a result of reduction in services prior to March 15, 2009.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the District reduce or eliminate the particular kinds of services or programs and reduce the corresponding number of full-time equivalent positions as set forth in attached Exhibit A and by this reference made a part hereof.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that as between employees who first rendered paid service to the District on the same date, that employees be laid off solely on the basis of the needs of the District, which need shall be based upon the following in priority order:

1. BCLAD certification;
2. CLAD certification;
3. Credentialed status (clear versus preliminary), if elementary, and credentialed in multiple areas, if secondary;
4. Expertise or specialty emphasis in a particular area of need to the District as follows: QUIA SB472, District Ten ELD Strategies, GATE training, technology coordinator, SLIP coordinator;
5. Completed staff development certificate/course work;
6. Currently providing instruction in intervention programs if elementary, and co-curricular assignments, if secondary; and
7. Advanced degrees.

If the criteria listed above do not break a tie, the District shall hold a lottery at least five work days prior to the layoff hearing. Each group of tied employees shall have the right to attend the lottery and pick a lottery number. In the absence of the employee, the Assistant Superintendent for Personnel Services will select a lottery number on behalf of the employee.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Superintendent of the District be and hereby is authorized and directed to give notices to certificated employees of the district as is necessary to implement this resolution and as required by District Rules and Regulations and applicable provisions of the Education Code of the State of California.
