Student Board Representative Elizabeth Yin provided a report of the activities and events occurring at the district’s high schools.

The Board recognized Elizabeth for her tenure on the Board of Education as the Student Board Representative.

SUPERINTENDENT’S REPORT

- Superintendent Greg Plutko recognized our Student Board Representative Elizabeth Yin as a great representative of our school district and her peers. She has a tremendous amount of poise and energy, writes well, and is going places.
- Dr. Plutko mentioned that as the new year begins he continues to go visit school classrooms. He is continually impressed with the engaged lesson planning that is taking place with our teachers from the “Daily 5” reading instruction to the connection with STEM work that is being done. He is impressed with the strong engagement continually shown throughout our district.
- The Superintendent and Mrs. Plahy were able to visit the Dual Language classes at Glenview. The program is in its first year, and the Superintendent is very proud of work being done there.
- Governor Brown came out today with his proposed budget. There is some concern with what the governor shared. There will be more information forthcoming in the May Revise. One thing we know is that where we begin is not always where we end. We will watch this closely for the Board.

- Superintendent Plutko told the Board about one of our first grade special needs students who is unable to move her body, except for her eyes. Even with this disability, she understands and responds to questions, and is able to physically attend class. Unfortunately, with the cold and flu season approaching, it is dangerous for this student to be in the classroom. Our district team has come together to help this student stay connected to her classmates and purchased a VGo robot, which the student named Aurora. Aurora stands approximately four feet tall, and features a display monitor that allows this student to participate in class while remaining in the safety of her own home. Dr. Plutko is proud that the district worked together to help this girl. Unique situations like this help us get smarter as we move forward.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

The Governing Board recognizes that parents/guardians are their children's first and most influential teachers and that sustained parent involvement in the education of their children contributes greatly to student achievement and a positive school environment. The Superintendent or designee shall work with staff and parents/guardians to develop meaningful opportunities at all grade levels for parents/guardians to be involved in district and school activities; advisory, decision-making, and advocacy roles; and activities to support learning at home.

Accordingly, the board is committed to:

1. Involving parents as participants in the decision-making process through School Site Council, and similar advisory programs.
2. Establishing effective two-way communication with all parents respecting the diversity and differing needs of families.
3. Developing strategies and programmatic structures at schools to enable parents to participate actively in their children's education programs.
4. Providing support and coordination for school staff and parents to implement and sustain appropriate parent involvement from preschool through grade twelve.
5. Utilizing schools to connect students and families with community resources which provide educational enrichment and support.
6. Coordinating and integrating parent involvement strategies with other programs.

Parents/guardians shall be notified of their rights to be informed about and to participate in their children's education and of the opportunities available to them to do so.

The Superintendent or designee shall regularly evaluate and report to the Board on the effectiveness of the district's parent involvement efforts, including, but not limited to, input from parents/guardians and school staff on the adequacy of parent involvement opportunities and barriers that may inhibit parent/guardian participation.

Title I Schools

Each year the Superintendent or designee shall identify specific objectives of the district's parent involvement program for schools that receive Title I funding. He/she shall ensure that parents/guardians are consulted and participate in the planning, design, implementation, and evaluation of the parent involvement program.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the district's parent involvement strategies are jointly developed with and agreed upon by parents/guardians of students participating in Title I programs. Those strategies shall establish expectations for parent involvement and describe how the district will carry out each activity listed in federal law.

The Superintendent or designee shall consult with parents/guardians of participating students in the planning and implementation of parent involvement programs, activities, and regulations. He/she also shall involve parents/guardians of participating students in decisions regarding how the district's Title I funds will be allotted for parent involvement activities.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that each school receiving Title I funds develops a school-level parent involvement policy in accordance with federal law.

Non-Title I Schools

The Superintendent or designee shall develop and implement strategies applicable to each school that does not receive federal Title I funds to encourage the involvement and support of parents/guardians in the education of their children, including, but not limited to, strategies describing how the district and school will address the purposes and goals described in Education Code 11502.

EDUCATION FOR ENGLISH LEARNERS

The Governing Board intends to provide English learners with challenging curriculum and instruction that develop proficiency in English as rapidly and effectively as possible while facilitating student achievement in the district's regular course of study.

The district shall identify in its local control and accountability plan (LCAP) specific actions and services to enhance student engagement, academic achievement, and other outcomes for English learners.

English learners shall be provided daily English language development (ELD) instruction. They will receive both Integrated ELD (every day, throughout the day in all content areas) to support their academic and linguistic development as well as Designated ELD (a protected time during the school day) targeted to their English proficiency level and aligned with the state content standards and curriculum framework. The district's program shall use standards-aligned instructional materials, assist students in accessing the full educational program, and be adequately supported so that English learners are provided with the opportunity to achieve at the same academic level as their English-proficient peers.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all staff employed to teach English learners possess the appropriate authorization from the Commission on Teacher Credentialing.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide to teachers, administrators, and other school staff research-based professional development that is designed to improve the instruction and assessment of English learners and enhance staff's ability to understand and use curricula, assessment, and instructional strategies for English learners.

The Superintendent or designee shall encourage parent/guardian and community involvement in the development, implementation, and evaluation of English language development programs.

Identification and Assessment

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain procedures which provide for accurate identification of English learners and an assessment of their proficiency in the areas of listening, speaking, reading, and writing in English.

Once identified as an English learner, a student shall be annually assessed for language proficiency until he/she is reclassified based on criteria specified in the accompanying administrative regulation.

English learners' academic achievement in English language arts, mathematics, science, and any additional subject required by law shall be assessed using the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress. As necessary, the test shall be administered with allowable testing variations in accordance with current guidelines. English learners who are in their first 12 months of attending a school in the United States shall be exempted from taking the English language arts assessment to the extent allowed by federal law.

Program Evaluation

To evaluate the effectiveness of the district's educational program for English learners, the Superintendent or designee shall report to the Board, at least annually, regarding:

1. Progress of English learners towards proficiency in English
2. The number and percentage of English learners reclassified as fluent English proficient
3. The number and percentage of English learners who are or are at risk of being classified as long-term English learners
4. The achievement of English learners on standards-based tests in core curricular areas
5. Progress toward any other goals for English learners identified in the district's LCAP
6. A comparison of current data with data from at least the previous year.

The Superintendent or designee also shall provide the Board with regular reports from any district or schoolwide English learner advisory committees.


