SUPERINTENDENT’S REPORT

Superintendent Plutko remarked that our district has a lot to celebrate in June as we finished another school year and are proud of our students’ accomplishments. Additionally, the hard work of all our teachers and classified staff is marked by our outstanding graduation. Dr. Plutko thanked Mr. Gary Farrell for an outstanding job live streaming at all graduations, which made it possible for families from around the country to watch. This was a high mark for our district and a great sign of more to come. We are in the “what’s next” mode and quickly beginning to prepare for the coming year.

Dr. Plutko called on Deputy Superintendent Candy Plahy to give a presentation on the work we have been doing around student wellness.

A special thank you was given to Assistant Superintendent David Giordano and his team for the installation of hydration stations at all of our schools. That was a big project this year in conjunction with our partnership with St. Jude.

Beginning in the same pathway as student wellness, we have a team coming together this summer to build “return to learn” protocols. As we consider the role that concussions play with our students we want to ensure that we have an updated clear design of protocols available for our principals, assistant principals, counselors, psychologists, etc. We are researching the opportunity to do baseline concussion testing for all of our student-athletes, so that if there is an injury to them later, a baseline test will be available for comparison. Dr. Plutko appreciates the Board’s direction and support in this area.

STAFF PRESENTATION

- Proposition 39 Program – Executive Director of Maintenance and Facilities, Rick Guaderrama, presented information on Proposition No. 39, which is titled the “Clean Energy Job Act.” The District anticipates receiving approximately \$5.7 million in Proposition 39 funding that will be utilized to help reduce energy costs throughout the District. It is a pleasure to see where they are going, including those that have enlisted or received full academy scholarships. Lastly, Mr. Padget asked if there was an update from staff regarding the homework policy.

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of a school district, as part of the required hearing, shall also make a written determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language, or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board for those subjects, and;

WHEREAS, the Governing Board shall also determine the availability of laboratory science equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in Grades 9 – 12, inclusive, and;

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on June 19, 2018, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to make a determination as to whether each pupil in each school in the district has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that is consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board:

- (i) Mathematics
- (ii) Science
- (iii) History-Social Science
- (iv) English/Language Arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program
- (v) Visual and Performing arts

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governing Board makes the determination that each pupil of the district, has available sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board and adopted by this Board in accordance with the procedures as established.

Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District

Bylaws of the Board

9150 - BB

STUDENT BOARD MEMBER

The Governing Board believes it is important to seek out and consider students' ideas, viewpoints, and reactions to the educational program. In order to provide student input and involvement, the Board shall include one student board member selected in accordance with procedures approved by the Board.

The term of the student board member shall be shared by two students over one calendar year, commencing on July 1. The student board member shall have the right to attend all Board meetings except closed session.

The Superintendent or designee will provide an orientation for the student board member to give them an understanding of the responsibilities and expectations of board service. This will include, but not be limited to, the requirements of the Brown Act.

The student board member shall be seated with elected Board members and be recognized at meetings as a full member. They may participate in questioning presenters and discussing issues and shall receive all materials presented to Board members except those related to closed sessions.

The student board member may be reimbursed for mileage but shall not receive compensation for attendance at Board meetings.

The student board member may cast preferential votes on all matters except those subject to closed session discussion. Preferential votes shall not affect the final numerical outcome of a vote. Preferential votes shall be recorded in the Board meeting minutes.

The student board member may make motions that may be acted upon by the Board, except on matters dealing with employer-employee relations pursuant to Government Code 3540-3549.3.

The student board member shall not be liable for any acts of the Board.

RESOLUTION REGARDING THE EDUCATION PROTECTION ACCOUNT

RESOLUTION NO. 32

WHEREAS, the voters approved Proposition 30 on November 6, 2012;

WHEREAS, Proposition 30 added Article XIII, Section 36 to the California Constitution effective November 7, 2012;

WHEREAS, the provisions of Article XIII, Section 36(e) create in the state General Fund an Education Protection Account to receive and disburse the revenues derived from the incremental increases in taxes imposed by Article XIII, Section 36(f);

WHEREAS, before June 30th of each year, the Director of Finance shall estimate the total amount of additional revenues, less refunds that will be derived from the incremental increases in tax rates made pursuant to Article XIII, Section 36(f) that will be available for transfer into the Education Protection Account during the next fiscal year;

WHEREAS, if the sum determined by the State Controller is positive, the State Controller shall transfer the amount calculated into the Education Protection Account within ten days preceding the end of the fiscal year;

WHEREAS, all monies in the Education Protection Account are hereby continuously appropriated for the support of school districts, county offices of education, charter schools, and community college districts;

WHEREAS, monies deposited in the Education Protection Account shall not be used to pay any costs incurred by the Legislature, the Governor, or any agency of state government;

WHEREAS, a community college district, county office of education, school district, or charter school shall have the sole authority to determine how the monies received from the Education Protection Account are spent in the school or schools within its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the governing board of the district shall make the spending determinations with respect to monies received from the Education Protection Account in open session of a public meeting of the governing board;

WHEREAS, the monies received from the Education Protection Account shall not be used for salaries or benefits for administrators or any other administrative cost;

WHEREAS, each community college district, county office of education, school district, and charter school shall annually publish on its Internet website an accounting of how much money was received from the Education Protection Account and how that money was spent;

WHEREAS, the annual independent financial and compliance audit required of community college districts, county offices of education, school districts, and charter schools shall ascertain and verify whether the funds provided from the Education Protection Account have been properly disbursed and expended as required by Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution;

WHEREAS, expenses incurred by community college districts, county offices of education, school districts, and charter schools to comply with the additional audit requirements of Article XIII, Section 36 may be paid with funding from the Education Protection Act and shall not be considered administrative costs for purposes of Article XIII, Section 36.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED:

1. The monies received from the Education Protection Account shall be spent as required by Article XIII, Section 36 and the spending determinations on how the money will be spent shall be made in open session of a public meeting of the governing board of Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District;

2. In compliance with Article XIII, Section 36(e), with the California Constitution, the governing board of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District has determined to spend the monies received from the Education Protection Act as attached.

In accordance with Government Code Section 4217.12, and based on data provided by the Analysis, the Board finds that the anticipated cost to the District for the conservation services provided by the Project will be less than the anticipated marginal cost to the District of electrical energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of those purchases.
3. The Board hereby approves the Energy Efficiency Agreement, which shall be subject to such changes, insertions, or omissions as the District’s Superintendent or designee reasonably deems necessary.

4. The District’s Superintendent or designee is hereby authorized and directed to negotiate any further changes, insertions, and omissions to the Energy Efficiency Agreement as are reasonably deemed necessary, and thereafter to execute and deliver the Energy Efficiency Agreement following the Board’s adoption of this Resolution. The District’s Superintendent or designee is further authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all papers, instruments, opinions, certificates, affidavits, and other documents and to do or cause to be done any and all other acts and things necessary or proper for carrying out this Resolution and said Agreement.

5. The Project is hereby found to be exempt from the requirements of CEQA pursuant to the Class 1, Class 2, Class 3, Class 11, and Class 14 Exemptions, as described above.

6. District staff are hereby authorized and directed to file and process a Notice of CEQA Exemption for the Project in accordance with CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines, and the findings set forth in this Resolution.
