STUDENT BOARD REPORT

Student Board Member Noah Campuzano provided a report of the activities and events occurring at the district's high schools.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Greg Plutko thanked Student Board Member Noah Campuzano for his well-prepared and informative report.

Dr. Plutko shared that in his ten years as a superintendent, he has not responded to a public speaker during a Board meeting, but wanted to do so tonight. Dr. Plutko addressed the two parents of special education children who spoke about the acute needs of their students not being met during distance learning. He apologized and let them know we can do better. At the same time, he indicated that he knows that the interim principal at George Key loves children and will do everything in her power to take care of kids. He let them know that a district administrator would contact them and expressed to them that he appreciated them being here this evening.

Superintendent Plutko stated how proud he was about the start that we did have in our district. We know that it is best with students and staff together, and there was an immense amount of love poured into being ready to bring something to our kids that would engage them. He thanked Purchasing Director Don Rosales and his team for getting supplies needed to start the school year and for staff from all over the district who helped put packets of those supplies together for our students for the start of school. Our transportation team helped get much-needed materials out to the schools. Dr. Plutko mentioned the preparation work of our teachers and how proud he was of the quality of the work they put forth. The Governor made an adjustment to the profile of how districts could go back. Based on this, the earliest date the district would be able to return to hybrid instruction would be September 23. At this time, the Board shared some thoughts on return to school dates and preparation time necessary for staff and families. The Board agreed that it was beneficial to select an aspirational date for planning purposes and also preferred the staggered start dates with special education and elementary students returning first. They could then revisit the aspirational date at the September 23 Special Board Meeting when there would be additional data. Dr. Plutko asked the Board if they would like a steering committee organized to look at an aspirational return to school date in the first couple of weeks of October. The Board would then reassess this date at the September 23 meeting.

BOARD REPORT

Mrs. Judi Carmona reported that she had the opportunity to experience the professional development via Zoom that was offered to our educational staff, teachers, and administrators, and the first class was fabulous. She was happy to participate with the educators and wanted to commend them for the great work that they do. Mrs. Carmona encouraged anyone interested in viewing these sessions to go online and view them.

Mrs. Carrie Buck mentioned that she had many interesting conversations over Zoom with family members who are in education comparing the challenges they are having. On the second day of school, Mrs. Buck talked with one of our kindergarten teachers who told her that our parents and staff were amazing during the first couple of days and the students were all engaged. She shared that Valadez staff had gone out to 50 students' homes to check on them and make sure they had what they needed. Valadez Principal Refugio Gracian and his team go above and beyond to ensure their students stay connected. Mrs. Buck informed everyone that over the summer HIS House became their own non-profit, now called HIS OC, and opened another shelter in Fullerton for young men. She is proud of their work.

Mrs. Carol Downey joked that she calls herself a Zoomer grandma. She shared that she viewed a video of how classrooms are prepared for students and wanted to thank the people involved in doing this. Mrs. Downey received good feedback on the first day of school. It has taken every staff member in the school district to get us back to school and make it as successful as possible and she wanted to thank staff for all they do.

Mrs. Karin Freeman also commended Valadez staff for physically going out into the community to make sure support was there for their students and families. PYLUSD staff has demonstrated that if there is a will there is a way and she wanted to thank them for all of their planning and hard work. She also thanked parents and support systems at home as there was a lot of anxiety to how things would start. Lastly, she highlighted an ROP summer school program called Medical Innovation and Entrepreneurship which combined science, law, business, and finance to impart a real-world view of the multi-disciplinary skills needed to thrive in the biotech entrepreneurial world. Five PYLUSD students took advantage of this innovative class.

Mr. Eric Padget thanked the two public speakers who came out tonight and commented that sometimes we don't do everything perfect. If you don't speak out, sometimes we wouldn't know. We will make it right moving forward. He made a couple of comments regarding reopening including thanking Dr. Plutko for good target dates moving forward. Mr. Padget mentioned that his full-time job is as a high school administrator in another district, and he lives this every day. It is difficult and scary sometimes. Some students thrive more on virtual learning and others do not. We need to move forward cognizant of the feelings of students and staff and know there is no one answer. President Padget asked Dr. Plutko and the other Board members to schedule a special board meeting on Thursday, September 10, at 5:00 p.m. to get the process started for the superintendent search. Mr. Padget closed by thanking everyone for coming to the meeting tonight.

RESOLUTION NO. 20-12
OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL
RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DEDICATION OF EASEMENT TO
CITY OF YORBA LINDA

WHEREAS, City of Yorba Linda (“City”) has previously requested that Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District (“School District”) dedicate an easement for installation of a traffic signal (“Easement”) upon a portion of the Yorba Linda High School site. A legal description and a map depicting the location of the Easement are attached hereto as Exhibits “A” and “B,” respectively, and are incorporated by reference herein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Section 17556, the governing board of a school district may convey to a municipal corporation or political subdivision of the state any real property belonging to such school district; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Section 17557, on August 11, 2020, the School District’s governing board, in a regular open meeting, by a two-thirds vote of all its members adopted Resolution No. 20-09 declaring its intention to dedicate the Easement; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Education Code Section 17557, the School District’s governing board fixed September 8, 2020, for a public hearing (“Public Hearing”) upon the question of making the dedication of Easement to City of Yorba Linda; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Section 17558, the District posted copies of Resolution No. 20-09 in three public places in the School District not less than ten (10) days before the Public Hearing, and published notice once, not less than five days before the Public Hearing, in a local newspaper; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Section 17558, on September 8, 2020, at a regular meeting of the School District’s governing board, the District held a Public Hearing upon the question about making the dedication of the Easement to City of Yorba Linda; and

WHEREAS, no petition pursuant to Education Code Section 17560 has been filed with the School District’s governing board.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the above recitals are all true and correct.

Section 2. That the Board of the School District hereby determines that the School District is in compliance with all applicable laws, and hereby approves granting of the Easement.

Section 3. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.

EXHIBIT "A"

Legal Description

In the City of Yorba Linda, County of Orange, State of California, being of portion of Section 23, Township 3 South, Range 9 West, San Bernardino Meridian, as shown on a Record of Survey filed in Book 74, page 37 of Records of Survey, records of said county, described as follows:

Commencing at the centerline intersection of Bastanchury Road and Princeton Place, as shown on Tract No. 17654, as per map recorded in Book 952 pages 12 through 17, inclusive, of Miscellaneous Maps, records of said county, said point being on a curve concave southerly having a radius of 2000.00 feet in the centerline of said Bastanchury Road, a radial line to said point bears North 2°47'34" East; thence along easterly along said curve and centerline an arc length of 47.17 feet through a central angle of 1°21'04"; thence leaving said centerline along a radial line to said 2000.00 foot radius curve, South 4°08'38" West, 42.00 feet to the southerly line of said Bastanchury Road, being the True Point of Beginning; thence leaving said southerly line, the following courses:

South 43°56'09" West, 15.97 feet;

North 86°33'49" West, 9.79 feet;

North 00°50'23" East, 4.44 feet;

North 88°17'42" West, 53.21 feet;

South 4°51'03" East, 8.37 feet;

South 86°38'00" west, 9.80 feet;

and North 52°53'39" West, 30.87 feet to said southerly line of Bastanchury Road; thence along said southerly line, South 89°00'00" East, 0.37 feet to the beginning of a curve concave southerly having a radius of 1958.00 feet and which is concentric with the above described curve having a radius of 2000.00 feet; thence easterly along said curve an arc length of 107.43 feet through a central angle of 3°08'38" to the True Point of Beginning.



WHEREAS, City of Yorba Linda (“City”) has previously requested that Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District (“School District”) dedicate an easement for management of landscape areas (“Easement”) upon a portion of the Yorba Linda High School site. A legal description and a map depicting the location of the Easement are attached hereto as Exhibits “A”, respectively, and are incorporated by reference herein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Section 17556, the governing board of a school district may convey to a municipal corporation or political subdivision of the state any real property belonging to such school district; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Section 17557, on August 11, 2020, the School District’s governing board, in a regular open meeting, by a two-thirds vote of all its members adopted Resolution No. 20-08 declaring its intention to dedicate the Easement; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Education Code Section 17557, the School District’s governing board fixed September 8, 2020, for a public hearing (“Public Hearing”) upon the question of making the dedication of Easement to City of Yorba Linda; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Section 17558, the District posted copies of Resolution No. 20-08 in three public places in the School District not less than ten (10) days before the Public Hearing, and published notice once, not less than five days before the Public Hearing, in a local newspaper; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Section 17558, on September 8, 2020, at a regular meeting of the School District’s governing board, the District held a Public Hearing upon the question about making the dedication of the Easement to City of Yorba Linda; and

WHEREAS, no petition pursuant to Education Code Section 17560 has been filed with the School District’s governing board.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the above recitals are all true and correct.

Section 2. That the Board of the School District hereby determines that the School District is in compliance with all applicable laws, and hereby approves granting of the Easement.

Section 3. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.



The actual appropriations limit for 2019-20 was \$175,679,596.97 and the appropriations did not exceed the limitations imposed by Article XIII-B of the California Constitution.

The appropriations limit for 2020-21 is estimated to be \$180,082,103.07 and the appropriations do not exceed the limitations imposed by Article XIII-B of the California Constitution.

5145.3 – BP

NONDISCRIMINATION/HARASSMENT

The Board of Education of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District is committed to providing a safe school environment that allows all students equal access to and opportunities in the district's academic, extracurricular, and other educational support programs, services, and activities. The Board prohibits, at any district school or school activity, unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, and/or bullying targeted at any student by anyone, based on the student's race, color, ancestry, nationality, national origin, ethnic group identification, ethnicity, age, religion, marital or parental status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, genetic information, or immigration status; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.

This policy shall apply to all acts constituting unlawful discrimination or harassment related to school activity or to school attendance occurring within a district school, and to acts which occur off campus or outside of school-related or school-sponsored activities which have a significantly adverse impact or create a hostile environment at school.

Unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, may result from physical, verbal, nonverbal, or written conduct based on any of the categories listed above. Unlawful discrimination also includes the creation of a hostile environment through prohibited conduct that is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it affects a student's ability to participate in or benefit from an educational program or activity; creates an intimidating, threatening, hostile, or offensive educational environment; has the effect of substantially or unreasonably interfering with a student's academic performance; or otherwise adversely affects a student's educational opportunities.

Unlawful discrimination also includes disparate treatment of students based on one of the categories above with respect to the provision of opportunities to participate in school programs or activities or the provision or receipt of educational benefits or services.

The Board also prohibits any form of retaliation against any individual who reports or participates in the reporting of unlawful discrimination, files or participates in the filing of a complaint, or investigates or participates in the investigation of a complaint or report alleging unlawful discrimination. Retaliation complaints shall be investigated and resolved in the same manner as a discrimination complaint.

The Superintendent or designee shall facilitate students' access to the educational program by publicizing the district's nondiscrimination policy and related complaint procedures to students, parents/guardians, and employees. In addition, The Superintendent or designee shall post the district's policies prohibiting discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and bullying and other required information on the district's web site in a manner that is easily accessible to parents/guardians and students, in accordance with law and the accompanying administrative regulation. He/she shall provide training and information on the scope and use of the policy and complaint procedures and take other measures designed to increase the school community's understanding of the requirements of law related to discrimination. The Superintendent or designee shall regularly review the implementation of the district's nondiscrimination policies and practices and, as necessary, shall take action to remove any identified barrier to student access to or participation in the district's educational program. He/she shall report his/her findings and recommendations to the Board after each review.

All complaints alleging unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, whether formal, or informal, shall be investigated and if found, prompt action shall be taken to stop the discrimination, prevent recurrence, and address any continuing effect on students.

Students who engage in unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying, in violation of law, Board policy, or administrative regulation shall be subject to appropriate consequence or discipline, which may include suspension or expulsion. Any employee who permits or engages in prohibited discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying, shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

Any student who feels that he/she is being harassed or who observes an incident of harassment should immediately contact the principal or designee. If a situation involving harassment is not promptly remedied by the principal or his/her designee, a formal complaint alleging discrimination/ harassment on the basis of a protected class can be filed with the district’s Compliance Officer in accordance with the Uniform Complaint Procedures set forth in BP 1312.3 and AR 1312.3, and if not on the basis of a protected class, via the district’s General Complaint policy and regulation, BP and AR 1312.1.

This policy shall be posted in all schools and offices including student government meeting rooms and the staff lounge.

Record Keeping

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain a record of all formal complaints of unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, to enable the district to monitor, address, and prevent repetitive prohibited behavior in district schools.

NONDISCRIMINATION IN DISTRICT PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES

The Board of Education is committed to providing equal opportunity for all individuals in district programs and activities. District programs, activities, and practices shall be free from unlawful discrimination, including discrimination against an individual or group based on race, color, ancestry, nationality, national origin, ethnic group identification, ethnicity, age, religion, marital or parental status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, genetic information, or immigration status; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics. District programs and activities shall also be free of any racially derogatory or discriminatory school or athletic team names, mascots, or nicknames.

All individuals shall be treated equitably in the receipt of district and school services. Personally identifiable information collected in the implementation of any district program, including, but not limited to, student and family information for the free and reduced-price lunch program, transportation, or any other educational program, shall be used only for the purposes of the program, except when the Superintendent or designee authorizes its use for another purpose in accordance with law. Resources and data collected by the district shall not be used, directly or by others, to compile a list, registry, or database of individuals based on race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, ethnicity, national origin, or immigration status or any other category identified above.

Annually, the Superintendent or designee shall review District programs and activities to ensure the removal of any derogatory or discriminatory name, image, practice, or other barrier that may unlawfully prevent an individual or group in any of the protected categories stated above from accessing District programs and activities, including the use of facilities. He/she shall take prompt, reasonable actions to remove any identified barrier. The Superintendent or designee shall report his/her findings and recommendations to the Board after each review.

All allegations of unlawful discrimination in district programs and activities shall be investigated and resolved in accordance with the procedures specified in AR 1312.3 – Uniform Complaint Procedures.

The Superintendent or designee shall notify students, parents/guardians, employees, employee organizations, applicants for admission and employment, and sources of referral for applicants about the District's policy on nondiscrimination and related complaint procedures. Such notification shall be included in the annual parental notification distributed pursuant to Education Code 48980 and, as applicable, in each announcement, bulletin, catalog, handbook, application form, or other materials distributed to these groups. As appropriate, such notification shall be posted in district schools and offices, including staff lounges, student government meeting rooms, and other prominent locations and shall be posted on the district's website and, when available, district-supported social media.

In addition, the annual parental notification shall inform parents/guardians of their children's right to a free public education regardless of immigration status or religious beliefs, including information on educational rights issued by the California Attorney General. Alternatively, such information may be provided through any other cost-effective means determined by the Superintendent or designee.

The District’s nondiscrimination policy and related informational materials shall be published in a format that parents/guardians can understand. In addition, when 15 percent or more of a school’s students speak a single primary language other than English, those materials shall be translated into that other language.

Access for Individuals with Disabilities

District programs and facilities, viewed in their entirety, shall be in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and any implementing standards and/or regulations. When structural changes to existing district facilities are needed to provide individuals with disabilities access to programs, services, activities, or facilities, the Superintendent or designee shall develop a transition plan that sets forth the steps for completing the changes.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the District provides appropriate auxiliary aids and services when necessary to afford individuals with disabilities equal opportunity to participate in or enjoy the benefits of a service, program, or activity unless such provision would result in a fundamental alteration in the nature of a service, program, or activity or would result in undue administrative or financial burdens. These aids and services may include, but are not limited to, qualified interpreters or readers, assistive listening devices, assistive technologies or other modifications to increase accessibility to district and school websites, note takers, written materials, taped text, and Braille or large print materials.

Individuals with disabilities shall notify the Superintendent or principal if they have a disability that requires special assistance or services. Reasonable notification should be given prior to the school-sponsored function, program, or meeting.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION FROM COMPREHENSIVE HIGH SCHOOL

The Board of Education establishes the following requirements for the satisfactory completion of the high school program of study and for the granting of the high school diploma of graduation. The student will:

- 1. Successfully complete a minimum of 230 semester credits. (To be applied toward the completion of this requirement, any credit taken outside of the regular high school program while attending a district comprehensive high school must be approved in advance by the principal or his designee and by the parent/guardian and must relate to identified goals of the student.)

- 2. Successfully complete the specific requirements as indicated below:

- A. Language Arts: 4 years 40 credits
 - Language Arts 1 10 credits
 - Language Arts 2 10 credits
 - Language Arts 3..... 10 credits
 - Language Arts 4 or approved
 - Language Arts electives..... 10 credits

- B. Mathematics: 2 years 20 credits

Ten (10) credits of Algebra 1, or its equivalent as established in administrative regulations, are required for graduation. Acceptable completion of this course prior to ninth grade will meet this requirement.

- C. Social Science: 3 years 30 credits
 - World History/Culture/Geography or
 - AP European History 10 credits
 - U.S. History/Geography 10 credits
 - U.S. Government 5 credits
 - Economics 5 credits

- D. Science: 2 years 20 credits

To include instruction in biological and physical science.

- E. Physical Education: 2 years 20 credits
 - P.E./Wellness 9 or Athletics 10 credits
 - P.E./Wellness or Athletics 10 credits

- F. Visual or Performing Arts, World Language, Career Technical Education:
1 year 10 credits

Visual or performing arts includes courses from the fields of art, music, drama, humanities and dance. Dance may not be taken to satisfy both fine arts and physical education requirements.

- G. Health Education 5 credits

- H. Academic Studies and Career Planning 5 credits
or two years of Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID)
International Baccalaureate (IB) students are exempt from this requirement.

- I. Service Learning/Community Service 40 hours

- J. Elective Courses 80 credits

No more than twenty (20) of these elective credits may be earned in service-based courses. The 20 credits which may be accumulated from Grades 9-12 are office, classroom and library aides. This excludes home study. Such courses shall be periodically reviewed and designated by the Assistant Superintendent, Educational Services, to meet this requirement.

NOTE: In accordance with Education Code 51225.3, alternative means for students to complete the above prescribed courses of study may be developed and implemented with the approval of the superintendent or designee.

3. Maintain an acceptable level of citizenship during the period of high school enrollment up to and including the final graduation ceremony.
4. Transfer students must meet all requirements for high school graduation established by the State of California. Transfer students who had met the requirements of their former districts prior to enrollment will be required to meet only those requirements of this district which may reasonably be expected during the time remaining in the normal four-year period of attendance. An evaluation indicating remaining requirements shall be made immediately upon receipt of transfer records. This evaluation shall be interpreted to each student and parent/guardian concerned. Principals or their designated representatives shall have the authority to exercise discretion in this matter.
5. Pursuant to Education Code 51430, the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District may authorize retroactive high school diplomas to former students who are veterans of World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War, and to former students who were interned during World War II, under the conditions specified below.

A retroactive high school diploma may be granted to a former student who was interned by order of the federal government during World War II or who is an honorably discharged veteran of World War II, the Korean War, or the Vietnam War, provided that he/she was enrolled in the district immediately preceding the internment or military service and he/she did not receive a diploma because his/her education was interrupted due to the internment or military service. (Education Code 51430)

In addition, the Board may retroactively grant a diploma to a deceased former student who satisfies the above conditions. The diploma shall be received by the deceased student's next of kin. (Education Code 51430)

Principals are designated the authority to resolve issues which may arise in the transition periods caused by changes in graduation requirements.

Administrative regulations shall be established to facilitate the implementation of this policy.


